Here's what we heard in your neighborhood

Chinatown residents shared clear priorities for how to make their neighborhood better. Affordable housing was at the top of the list: residents want to see vacant parcels and publicly-owned land redeveloped for new low- and middle-income housing.

Open space and public amenities are also very important. Specific ideas included parks, a library, a theater, and a community center for children and elders.

Residents also emphasized transportation improvements, especially easing congestion in Chinatown and making it easier to get to recreational destinations like Castle Island, Franklin Park, and the Harbor Islands.
