

SPEED HUMP

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Speeding is a concern throughout neighborhood
- Need speed humps on Howard Ave and Fayston east of Perth

- Place speed humps on Howard Ave. (total of 3)
- Fayston will have one between Mascoma and Perth




SPEED HUMPS

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Speeding is a concern throughout neighborhood
- Need speed humps on Howard Ave and Fayston east of Perth

- Place speed humps on Howard Ave. (total of 3)
- Fayston will have one between Mascoma and Perth



HOWARD AT BEAUFORD

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Drivers speed on Howard Avenue
- Blind spot on the turn from Howard to Beauford

- Discourges drivers from accelerating around at the curve
- Encourages drivers to slow before turning from Howard to Beauford



WAYLAND AT HOWARD

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Need more crosswalks
- Blind spot on the turn from Howard to Wayland
- Lots of people cross
 Wayland St in front of the store

- Raised crosswalk across
 Wayland St. near store
- Add a crosswalk across Wayland St.
- Howard and Wayland St. improve ramps and add crosswalk



WAYLAND and CUNNINGHAM

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Street is too narrow for two-way travel
- Residents requested one-way streets

- Wayland one-way away from Howard
- Cunningham one-way to Howard




WAYLAND and BIRD

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Concerns with closing Wayland St.
- Turn from Magnolia to Wayland is sharp
- Concerns that changing Ceylon to one-way would impact Alexander

- No longer proposing change to street directions
- Daylighting? (needs to be confirmed)
- Paint & flex posts at Bird/Ceylon/Alexander



LAWRENCE AVENUE

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Congestion during school pick-up/drop-off
- Blind corner at Lawrence and Mascoma

- Parking restriction during school days, ONLY on south side of street
- Corner parking restriction to keep sidewalks clear and avoid "blind corners"



CHILDREN'S PARK CROSSWALK

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Long blocks without crosswalks
- Crossing the street is difficult for people living with disabilities

- Raised crosswalk to slow drivers
- Sidewalk extended to reduce crossing distance and keep sidewalks clear of parked cars



GENEVA AVE CROSSWALK

WHAT WE HEARD:

- Cars speed
- Unsafe for everyone to cross in front of community center

- Raised crosswalk to slow drivers and improve safety for everyone trying to cross
- Speed feedback sign



Timeline:

- Fall 2019: Seek <u>final approval</u> from Public Improvement Commission.
- Winter 2020: Schedule construction and notify residents
- Spring 2020: Begin construction
