**ORDERED:**



- I. That the City accepts Sections 22A, 22B and 22C of Chapter 40 of the General Laws, as amended by Chapter 218 of the Acts of 2016 – *the Municipal Modernization Act*, for the purpose of maintain a parking meter fund reserved for appropriation;

With approval, this fund may be used for acquisition, installation, maintenance and operation of parking meters and other parking payment and enforcement technology, the regulation of parking, salaries of parking management personnel, improvements to the public realm, and transportation improvements; and be it

- II. That all funds currently held or received by the City for this purpose, be maintained in the *Parking Meter Fund* and reserved for further appropriation in accordance with the City Charter.

TO THE CITY COUNCIL

Dear Councilors:

I transmit herewith for your approval an acceptance of the provisions of G.L. c.40, §22A, 22B and 22C, as amended by Chapter 218 of the Acts of 2016 (the Municipal Modernization Act). This local option allows municipalities to continue to account for parking receipts separately and to keep receipts reserved for appropriation.

With your approval, the parking meter receipts will be deposited into the parking meter fund reserved for appropriation for acquisition, installation, maintenance and operation of parking meters and other parking payment and enforcement technology, the regulation of parking, salaries of parking management personnel, improvements to the public realm, and transportation improvements.

I respectfully urge your Honorable Body to accept this local option.
