- Other User Groups (not listed)
 - Neponset Men's Basketball
 - Street Hockey League
- It is really hot in the park in summer. Can we add shade? What else can add shade in addition to trees?
 - BPRD is exploring different kinds of elements for cooling. Project team will bring ideas to Community Meeting 2.
- City council Frank Baker asks about BPRD's response to safety concerns of artificial turf.
 - o LB: only the safe materials are chosen for projects.
- Frank Baker comments that the project schedule is aggressive and asks whether a working group would be helpful?
 - LB: the project schedule is aligned with project funding. A working group is a
 possibility.
- What are examples of other parks GroundView has done in the area? Please visit other parks in the neighborhood of Garvey.
 - o LB: GV is the designer of Chuckie Harris Park in Somerville.
 - GV: Next meeting's presentation will include project examples that will be both
 GV's work and other relevant precedent projects.

The larger group broke into three small groups. The small groups to discussed ideas for improvements around an existing site plan. A recording of the comments are as follows:

Small Group Discussion at Eden's table:

- (want) State of the art (athletic) facility
- (artificial)Turf
- Drainage (is a problem)
- (not a) level playing field (surface)
- Puddles at lip (of infield/outfield)
- (some people like) Dirt at base (with artificial turf)
- current baseball field orientation is ideal, foul balls
- (add) Softball/little league (field, opposite of babe ruth field)
- (want field sized for) 13-15 age group baseball field, Babe Ruth Sr.
- Extra time for soccer, not ahead of baseball (permit)
- Permitting parties? (Keep) Men's league
- The field is uneven and hilly, not good for sports
- Dips on south edge of field
- Artificial turf expands the season
- Grass vs. Turf?
- Cost of drainage infrastructure?
- High tide wet spots (on Morrissey BLVD)
- Low point (DCR property, no drain west side of building)
- There is NO SHADE (need more shade)
- Need seating in shaded area for south edge of fields
- Dug outs for shading? but homeless concern
- (concrete) Bleacher go? (make room for other program)
 - like Roberts bleachers
- (put) Seating in (existing) shaded area
- Move playlot? (closer to street)
- Tot lot is too shaded. Can't see child.

- Slight lines? (into the park are not good, especially tot lot)
- Ramp? (at the stair entrance)
- Fireman's Association (occupy the Neponset Veteran's Association property)? At the periphery of the park (stair entrance)
- Street hockey to have seating area in shade
- Street hockey: Breaking lights?
- Indoor/outdoor facility
- Move street hockey and basketball(to DCR land next to their parking lot)
- Dog lot on DCR's land? (north corner)
- Dog Park (on Southern DCR property)
 - o Contact Dan Hunt
- At least pick up after dog sign?
- 3 Bubblers (field, tot lot, courts)
- Restroom (need facilities for events)
- (renovate) Field house (it is an extension of BCYF) community center
- Track?
- Circuit training (throughout park)
- (don't want) sprinkler (water play. Available at nearby park)
- New condo development on the north edge?
- Flooding on the northwest edge (in abutters property)
- Solid fence (for abutters)
- New edge treatment like the retaining wall (perimeter of park)
- Temporary lights in eyes of abutters
- Direction at lighting for abutters??
- Improve and lighting extend season
- Improve northwest edge
- Clean up trash at Tedeschi site
- Other Parks like:
 - Murphy school play ground
 - Hemenway Park
 - Elliot Street Park in Milton
 - Lending Library
 - Robert's Park (field)

Small Group Discussion at Will's table:

- Would DCR give up the woody land behind the street hockey rink?
- Basketball at night
- Teenagers drinking in the street hockey rink and the playlot
- Responders (police) are seen before kids drinking are seen
- Dog park for the canopy area outside the playlot
- No wood chips in play lot
- Cedar grove baseball representatives prefer synthetic turf
- Cedar grove baseball representatives prefer similar layout to existing
- Cedar grove baseball representatives don't want to light fields for night games due to courtesy for neighbors
- Flag football (they think) needs 80 yards
- Two softball leagues share one field (shortage). Softball league serves kids age 5-18
- Simpler the better
- Dan Hunt (State Representative) could be helpful in acquiring or getting permission to use DCR land
- Wonderful park!
- Field house needs full renovation

- One participant expressed concerns over the health risks of artificial turf; asks what data have you looked at?
- Bad entry on the north side coming down from parking lot
- Themes
 - More visibility (Neponset Ave., and Wooded area)
 - o Maintain use for current permit holders at minimum
 - New walking loop/ track with exercise stations along it
 - Improve entries
 - Is budget enough? Cost of artificial turf vs. natural lawn; cost of stormwater improvements

Small Group Discussion at Lauren and Mia's table

- Baseball field is very important. Do not remove.
- Improve fields
- Can we utilizing space between baseball field and playlot?
- Can we add Bathroom? Currently sport teams using the field is responsible to clean and lock the bathroom in field house
- Community concern about light at night.
- Temporary lighting for 6pm to 8pm in fall for field.
- No light at night
- Well-lit path for safety
- Other uses of the field:
- To watch game
- To watch concert
- (all require seating)
- Playground location is too setback
- Needs seating
- Current bleacher
- Lockers on both ends
- Pope John Paul fields day fills the bleacher
- Future bleacher: two smaller ones. To have on each side of the baseball field
- Maybe add dugout to baseball field
- Maintenance for street hockey
- Dog park? People don't use it/don't clean
- Need dog bag dispensers
- Concerns for people use pavilion structures but don't clean after themselves
- Concerns about homeless using a pavilion
- Field house needs full renovation
- Needs storage for sport team (flag football) facilities
- Maybe to have small water feature, not big ones
- Expand playlot. Maybe add areas for different age group?
- Safety concerns about climbing ropes for younger kids.
- Add walking path/ to have a circulation loop, improve pedestrian accessibility on the bleacher side of the baseball field
- Like natural grass

The small groups reconvened as a large group and shared comments discussed.
