I'M CHAIR OF THE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION.

I'M JOINED BY LEAD SPONSOR AND VICE CHAIR OF THIS ORDER, CITY COUNCILOR ANNEALING SAW ESSAIBI GEORGE.

I WANT TO REMIND THAT YOU THIS IS PUBLIC HEARING, IT'S BEING RECORDED WILL BE BROADCAST ON COMCAST CHANNEL 8, RN CHANNEL 82

VERIZON 12964 AND ONLINE.

PLEASE SILENCE YOUR CELL PHONES AND OTHER DEVICES.

WE'LL ALSO TAKE PUBLIC TESTIMONY I APPRECIATE IF YOU WOULD SIGN IN AND BE SURE TO CHECK OFF THE BOX TO TESTIFY.

PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME, AFFILIATION, RESIDENCE AND LIMIT YOUR COMMENTS TO A FEW MINUTES TO ENSURE THAT ALL COMMENTS AND CONCERNS CAN BE HEARD.

TODAY'S HEARING IS ON DOCKET NO. 0196, ORDER FOR HEARING REGARDING REGULATIONS AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE RESIDENCY POLICY FOR BOSTON SCHOOLS DEPARTMENT.

I WOULD LIKE TO THANK MONICA ROBERTS FOR THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND SCARE LYNN MACNEIL FOR JOINING US THIS MORNING. COUNCILOR ESSAIBI GEORGE? >> THANK YOU, CHAIRMAN. THANK YOU FOR HOSTING THAT MEETING THIS MORNING. THANK YOU BOTH FOR BEING HERE TODAY.

I AM EXCITED TO GET BACK TO THIS RESIDENCY HEARING TO TALK ABOUT STUDENT RESIDENCY IN THE BPDA BPS AS YOU WOULD RECALL, WE HAD A HEARING OVER A YEAR AGO TALKING ABOUT RESIDENCY IN THE CITY OF BOSTON AS IT PERTAINS TO THE SCHOOLS AND WORK THAT HAPPENED TO DATE.

TO UNDERSTAND THE CHANGES THAT THAT HAVE HAPPENED OVER THE COURSE OF THE LAST SCHOOL YEAR AND THEN LEADING INTO THE CURRENT SCHOOL YEAR TO UNDERSTAND HOW THE POLICY HAS BEEN UPDATED AND IMPROVED, IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING THAT THERE HAVE BEEN SOME IMPROVEMENTS AND AS RESULT OF THOSE IMPROVEMENTS THERE HAVE BEEN A NUMBER OF CASES, ADDITIONAL NUMBER OF CASES THAT HAVE COME FORWARD. FOR ME RESIDENCY -- OR SKIRTING WAS RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS IN THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS IS --CERTAINLY NOT A PROBLEM I HAD WITH OUR CHILDREN, OUR STUDENTS. IT'S A PROBLEM OF PARENTS CHOOSING TO SKIRT THE SYSTEM. AND FALSIFY RESIDENCY DOCUMENTS OR MOVE DURING A STUDENT'S TIME IN OUR SCHOOLS AND NOT UPDATE THEIR RECORDS IN BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS SO I'M EXCITED TO LEARN ABOUT ALL THAT'S HAPPENED OVER THE COURSE OF THE LAST 18 MONTHS OR SO.

AND UNDERSTAND HOW WE CAN DO MORE TO IMPROVE THE PROCESS. BOTH TO PROTECT OUR SEATS FOR OUR STUDENTS AND TO MAKE SURE THAT THOSE THAT ARE SKIRTING THE SYSTEM AND STEALING SERVICES AND SEATS FROM OUR KIDS ARE HELD ACCOUNTABLE AND BILLED ACCORDINGLY.

THANK YOU, CHAIR, FOR THAT I LOOK FORETOWARD TO HEARING THE TESTIMONY TODAY.

>> THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

I THINK IN ADDITION TO OUR LEAD SPONSORS' COMMENTS IT'S ALSO IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND THAT THE CITY OF BOSTON IS A HIGH COST AREA AND THAT PEOPLE ARE BEING DISPLACED EVERY SINGLE DAY.
MY OFFICE ON WEEKLY BASIS ATTENDS TO 50, 60 FAMILIES THAT ARE BEING DISPLACED AND ARE HAVING TO MOVE.

SO I WOULD REALLY ALSO LIKE TO HEAR ANY CONNECTION THAT THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS DEPARTMENT

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT ARE MAKING AROUND THESE AREAS AND ISSUES.

AND WE KNOW THAT AN INDIVIDUAL IS DEFINED AS HOMELESS -- I THINK THE OTHER COMPONENT THAT THE DEFINITION AND REQUIREMENTS TO BE CONSIDERED HOMELESS AND STATE OF MASSACHUSETTS HAVE CHANGED IN THE PAST COUPLE OF YEARS.

AND THE REQUIREMENT NOW IF YOU WERE TO SAY THAT YOU ARE SLEEPING ON THE COUCH OF A FAMILY MEMBER THAT YOU ARE ACTUALLY IN THIS STATE NOT CONSIDERED HOMELESS, WHICH IS REALLY PROBLEMATIC. SO I GUESS WITH THE ISSUES, \$2200 A MONTH ONE BEDROOM APARTMENT WHICH IS THE AVERAGE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON. KNOWING THAT YOUR STUDENT POPULATION IS -- MANY OF THE STUDENTS AND FAMILIES WOULD HAVE BEEN DEFINED IN THE OLD FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH POOL AND THEY'RE POOR, WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THAT SPACE.

I THINK THAT IS COMPLICATING FACTOR WHEN IT COMES TO THESE ISSUES.

WE LOOK FORWARD TO YOUR TESTIMONY.

MONICA, CAROLYN, WHOEVER IS GOING TO START.

>> GOOD MORNING, THANK YOU, CHAIRMAN JACKSON AND COUNCILOR ESSAIBI GEORGE FOR HAVING US HERE TODAY.

I'M MONICA ROBERTS, ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF THE WAS OF ENGAGEMENT, I AM HERE WITH MY COLLEAGUE WHO IS OUR OMBUDSMAN FOR BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS. I WOULD START WITH JUST AN OVERVIEW OF THE RESIDENCY VERIFICATION PROCESS.

WE'LL TALK ABOUT THE INVESTIGATORY FRONT.
THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS REQUIRES THE STUDENT TO BE BOSTON RESIDENTS, RESIDENCY DEFINED AS THE PLACE WHERE A

PERSON DWELLS PERMANENTLY, NOT TEMPORARILY IS THE PLACE THAT IS CENTER OF HIS OR HER DOMESTIC, SOCIAL AND CIVIC LIFE.
WHEN REGISTERING FOR SCHOOL FOR THE FIRST TIME FAMILIES MUST PRODUCE TWO PROOFS OF RESIDENCY. VERIFICATION IS NOT REQUIRED AGAIN AFTER INITIAL ENTRY AT THE TIME.

BPS EMPLOYS ONE RESIDENCY INVESTIGATOR WHO REPORTS TO THE OMBUDSMEN TO ADDRESS THE VIOLATION OF THIS POLICY DUE TO RESIDENCY FRAUD HOTLINE. IT'S IMPORTANT TO NOTE THAT THESE REQUIREMENTS DO NOT APPLY TO INDIVIDUALS OR FAMILIES WHO ARE IDENTIFIED AS HOMELESS. SERVICES ARE CURRENTLY DEVELOPING GUIDANCE FOR SCHOOL STAFF INCLUDING TEACHERS, OUTLINE POTENTIAL SIGNS THAT A PERSON MAY NOT LIVE IN THE CITY AND STEPS TO BE TAKEN WHEN THIS IS SUSPECTED.

GIVEN MANY TRAVEL TO SCHOOL AND OTHER FAMILY AND NEIGHBORHOOD FACTORS, BPS ADDRESSING THAT CAUTIOUSLY.

DO NOT WANT SCHOOLS TO IDENTIFY FAMILIES FROM HISTORICALLY MARGINALIZED, THAT WOULD RESULT IN BEHAVIORS THAT RAISE INACCURATE SUSPICIONS OF NONRESIDENCY.

EXAMPLES INCLUDE PERSISTENT TARDINESS, STUDENTS REPORTING MOVING TO ANOTHER CITY OR TOWN. ALL OF WHICH COULD BE INDICATOR OF HOMELESSNESS.

CAN ARE NOT REQUIRED TO REPORT THEIR HOMELESS STATUS TO THE CHILD'S SCHOOL AND WORKING HOW WE IMPROVE THAT FOR COMMUNICATION.

WORTH NOTING THAT FAMILIES WHO WANT TO CHEAT THE SYSTEM CAN FIND WAYS TOO PRODUCE REQUIRED DOCUMENT TIKES CIRCUMVENT THE RULES.

RENTING OR OWNING A BOSTON-BASED RESIDENCY WHILE LIVING WELL OR ALLOW USE OF THEIR ADDRESS.

DIFFICULT TO DETECT AND CONFIRM SUCH CASES WHICH IS WHY WE HAVE THE OFFICER.

BUT THESE CHALLENGES IN MIND THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS HAVE INTERNAL TEAM WORKING ON THREE POTENTIAL OPTIONS HOW WE MIGHT PRO-ACTIVELY GET AT THE RESIDENCY ISSUE, PART OF WHAT WE'RE LOOKING AT IS THE FEASIBILITY BECAUSE SOME OF THEM MIGHT REQUIRE NEGOTIATIONS WITH DIFFERENT UNION BODIES AS WELL AS EQUITY IMPACT OR MAKING SURE THAT WE ARE NOT NEGATIVELY IMPACTING FAMILIES WHO ARE ALREADY EXPERIENCING CHALLENGES. SO WE'RE GOING TO OUR PLANNING AND VETTING PROCESS, WE HOPE TO START GATHERING COMMUNITY AND FAMILY INPUT, WANT TO ALSO HEAR FROM THE BOSTON CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS AS TO THEIR THOUGHTS ON SOME OF THE OPTION, IS THAT WE ARE HOPING TO PROPOSE.

I THINK MOST CRITICALLY IN THE CURRENT CLIMATE THAT WE'RE IN WE HAVE BEEN THINKING ABOUT THIS ISSUE OF EQUITY, WE KNOW THAT FOR MANY OF OUR FAMILIES, LOT OF OUR FAMILIES EACH YEAR ARE IN THE COUNTRY VERY RECENTLY AND PRODUCING RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS IS CHALLENGING.

IF YOU ARE NEW TO THE CITY, NEW TO THE STATE.

THESE ARE SOME OF THE FACTORS
THAT WE'RE LOOKING AT AS WE ARE
LOOKING TO OUR OPTIONSW THAT
I'LL TURN OVER TO CAROLYN.
>> GOOD MORNING, THANK YOU FOR
INVITING ME TO TESTIFY ON
WHATEVER OF THE BOSTON PUBLIC
SCHOOLS REGULATION AND
ENFORCEMENT OF THE BPS RESIDENCY
POLICY.

IT'S A VERY IMPORTANT ISSUE AND WE'RE PLEASED THAT YOU ARE CONVENING ANOTHER DISCUSSION ON THIS TOPIC, MY NAME IS CAROLYN MACNEIL, THE OMBUDSMEN FOR THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

I SERVE AS AN OBJECTIVE AND NEUTRAL PARTY WITHIN BOSTON

PUBLIC SCHOOLS SYSTEM.
THE OMBUDSMEN IS CENTRAL POINT
OF CONTACT AND RESOURCE FOR
PARENTS AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE
COMMUNITY WHO HAVE CONCERNS
RELATED TO OUR SCHOOLS IN THE
DISTRICT.

I REPRESENT THE SUPERINTENDENT'S OFFICE AND PART OF MY RELATED DUTIES IS OVERSEEING THE RESIDENCY INVESTIGATIONS FOR THE DISTRICT.

MAYOR WALL MUCH ALONG WITH SUPERINTENDENT CHANG ARE WORKING TO CREATE EQUITABLE AND INNOVATIVE SCHOOL SYSTEM.
GREATLY VALUE CITY RESIDENTS HAVING FULL ACCESS TO OUR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

AND A STRONG RESIDENCY POLICY AND THE RIGOROUS ENFORCEMENT SUPPORTS THESE VALUES.

AS THE STATE CONTINUES TO PROVIDE LESS AND LESS REIMBURSE TOMORROW SCHOOL DISTRICTS, IT IS IMPORTANT THAT BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL SEATS ARE FILLED WITH OUR RESIDENTS.

IN DETERMINING RESIDENCY, BPS RESERVES THE RIGHT TO REQUEST VARIETY OF DOCUMENTATION AND CONDUCT AN INVESTIGATION INTO WHERE A STUDENT ACTUALLY RESIDES.

BECAUSE RESIDENCY CAN AND OFTEN DOES CHANGE FOR STUDENTS AND THEIR FAMILIES DURING THE COURSE OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR, BPS MAY CONTINUE TO VERIFY RESIDENCY AFTER THE COMMENCEMENT OF CLASSES.

ALSO IS BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS MAY ACT UPON ANONYMOUS TIPS WE RECEIVE TO CONDUCT A RESIDENCY VERIFICATION INVESTIGATION.
WE ARE PARTICULARLY SENSITIVE TO THE NEEDS OF OUR FAMILIES FROM HISTORICALLY MARGINALIZED POPULATIONS WHO MAY BE EXPERIENCING LIFE CHALLENGES THAT RESULT IN BEHAVIORS THAT RAISE INACCURATE SUSPICION.
THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS DISTRICT RECEIVES INFORMATION OF

RESIDENCY VIOLATIONS FROM A VARIETY OF SOURCES, INCLUDING OUR ANONYMOUS TIP LINE, TEACHERS AND SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, FAMILIES, STUDENTS AND COMMUNITY RESIDENTS.

ALL TIPS AND INFORMATION ARE FOLLOWED UP ON AND VIGOROUSLY INVESTIGATED.

OUR RESIDENCY POLICY WHICH WAS REVISED IN SEPTEMBER 2013 TO INCLUDE ELIGIBLE STUDENTS APPLYING TO EXAM SCHOOL STATES THAT IN ORDER TO ATTEND A BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS A STUDENT MUST ACTUALLY RESIDE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

THE RESIDENCE OF MINOR CHILD IS PRESUMED TO BE THE LEGAL, PRIMARY RESIDENCE OF THE PARENTS OR GUARDIAN WHO HAVE PHYSICAL CUSTODY OF THE CHILD.

RESIDENCY AS DEFINED AS PLACE
WHERE A PERSON DWELLS
PERMANENTLY, NOT TEMPORARILY
SAND THE PLACE THAT IS THE
CENTER OF HIS OR HER DOMESTIC,
SOCIAL AND CIVIC LIFE.

OUR POLICY OUTLINED IN DETAIL ON OUR WEBSITE.

IT IS DISTRIBUTED TO FAMILIES THROUGH OUR FAMILY AND STUDENT HANDBOOK AND ANNUALLY TO EVERY STUDENT AND FAMILY THAT ATTENDS SCHOOL.

CAROLYN AND MONICA WOULD YOU WALK ME THROUGH THE PROCESS OF CONFIRMING A STUDENT'S RE RESIDENCY?

I'M APPLYING TO BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS OR APPLYING TO TAKE ONE OF THE EXAMS, DOESN'T MATTER WHICH ONE JUST CURIOUS OF THE DOCUMENTS THAT ARE REQUIRED AND ALL OF THAT.

>> SO, WE ASK FAMILIES TO BRING IN TWO OF SIX PROOF OF RESIDENCY A UTILITY BILL, CAN'T DO THINGS LIKE MOBILE PHONES.

A LEASE OR A STATEMENT OF AFT FROM A LANDLORD OR WHOEVER YOU'RE STAYING WITH, THERE ARE ABOUT SIX DOCUMENTS THAT FAMILIES CAN BRING IN THEY HAVE TO PHYSICALLY BRING THEM IN, HAVE TO BE WITHIN LAST 60 DAYS WHICH IS WHY IT PRESENTS A CHALLENGE FOR OUR FAMILIES WHO ARE RECENTLY RELOCATING TO THE CITY.

AND OUR TEAM CHECKS THEM AGAINST THEIR IDENTIFICATION AND MAKES COPIES THOSE GO ON RECORD AS PART OF THEIR REGISTRATION PROCESS.

THE EXAM SCHOOL, PROCESS IS COMING IN JUST FOR TO TAKE THE TEST SO THEN WE ARE ISSUING PROOF OR CERTIFICATE THAT YOU HAVE COME IN AND VERIFIED RESIDENCY.

YOU HAVE TO HAVE THAT IN HAND IN ORDER TO SIT FOR THE BPS ADMINISTRATION OF THE ISCE. >> THEN COULD YOU WALK ME THROUGH THE PROCESS OF REVIEWING A TIP.

SO A PHONE CALL OR E-MAIL OR LETTER COMES IN NOTING THAT A STUDENT, SUSPICIOUS OF NOT LIVING IN THE CITY WHAT IS THE PROCESS OF REVIEWING THAT TIP AND/OR THAT COMPLAINT? >> SO, GENERALLY SPEAKING, WE'LL GET INFORMATION WHETHER IT'S AN E-MAIL OR TIP THROUGH A PHONE CALL AND THE RESIDENCY INVESTIGATOR WILL FOLLOW UP WITH THE PERSON WHO CALLS, GENERALLY SPEAKING, I WOULD SAY WE DON'T GET AN AWFUL LOT OF ANONYMOUS, FOR THE MOST PART IT'S EITHER A TEACHER, PRINCIPAL, ADMINISTRATOR, MORE LIKELY THAN NOT THE RESIDENCY INVESTIGATOR FOLLOWS UP, ASKS FOR AS MUCH INFORMATION AS POSSIBLE. THEN AGAIN BASED ON THE INFORMATION WE'LL DO A SERIES OF OBSERVATIONS, WE UTILIZE THE RMV RECORDS, WE TO GO LAND COURT, WE DO PROPERTY SEARCHES.

A NUMBER OF DIFFERENT AVENUES TO VET OUT THE INFORMATION THAT WE RECEIVE.

WE HAVE PROBABLY WITHIN LAST YEAR STARTED WORKING WITH THE ASSESSING OFFICER, ASSESSOR'S OFFICE SO THAT HAS NOTED US SOME REALLY GOOD INFORMATION.

SO WE WORK CLOSELY WITH THEM.

AND SO I THINK FOR THE MOST PART -- A LOT DID OBSERVATIONAL.

INFORMATION THAT WE FIND FROM OTHER OUTLETS.

>> WE HAVE HOW MANY

INVESTIGATORS?

>> ONE FULL TIME.

>> ONE FULL TIME. IS THAT COMPARABLE TO OTHER

DISTRICTS?

>> IT'S BEEN MY EXPERIENCE IN SEARCHING THAT, NO, THAT GENERALLY SPEAKING OTHER DISTRICTS EMPLOY -- HAVE MORE --HAVE GREATER NUMBERS OF STAFF. >> RIGHT.

I KNOW I REACHED OUT TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT IN REVERE, I THINK FOR THEIR 7,000 STUDENTS OR SO THIS IS A LITTLE BIT AGO, BUT IN REVERE HAVE SOMETHING LIKE 7,000 STUDENTS THAT ATTEND THEIR SCHOOLS, WE HAVE 57,000 THEY HAVE TWO OR THREE INVESTIGATORS.

THEN SIMILAR CASE IN MILTON, THOSE TWO DISTRICTS ON OCCASION OR PROBABLY MORE THAN JUST ON OCCASION HAVE STUDENTS THAT ARE BOSTON RESIDENTS ATTENDING THEIR SCHOOLS.

SO THERE'S THIS BACK AND FORTH THAT HAPPENS WITH OUTSIDE DISTRICTS.

BUT MILTON AND REVERE HAVE MUCH SMALLER STUDENT POPULATIONS BUT SEEM TO HAVE LARGER NUMBER OF INVESTIGATORS.

>> I TEND TO WORK CLOSELY WITH THE SURROUNDING TOWNS.

>> I DON'T KNOW IF -- YOU DON'T HAVE AN IDEA OF SOME OF THE OTHER DISTRICTS THOSE I JUST HAPPEN TO KNOW.

HOW MANY STUDENTS AND HOW MANY INVESTIGATORS.

>> I DON'T KNOW THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS BUT I KNOW THAT THEY HAVE TWO.

>> TWO INVESTIGATORS.

AND FEWER STUDENTS THAN WE HAVE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

CAN YOU TALK ABOUT THE LAST TIME -- LAST TIME RESIDENCY

POLICY WAS UPDATED WAS IN 201.

ARE THERE ANY EFFORTS UP TO DATE IT FOUR-PLUS YEARS AGO NOW, ANY

IT FOUR-PLUS YEARS AGO NOW,

EFFORTS TO UPDATE IT?

>> I THINK WE GO THROUGH THIS PROCESS OF THINKING ABOUT HOW WE MIGHT SHIFT THE FRONT END OF RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS, THAT WILL FEED INTO ANY SHIFTS INTO THE POLICY THAT ARE NEEDED TO MAKE THAT HAPPEN.

>> AND THEN CAN YOU SPEAK TO THE NUMBER OF DISCHARGES THAT HAVE HAPPENED OVER THE LAST FEW SCHOOL YEARS?

>> I HAVE NUMBERS FROM THE LAST ACADEMIC YEAR AND YEAR TO DATE INFORMATION.

LAST YEAR THERE WERE 10 RESIDENCY CASES BROUGHT TO OUR ATTENTION.

YOU.

>> 208 CASES.

>> 4 RESULTED IN DISCHARGES DUE

TO NONRESIDENCY.

37 CASES WERE RESOLVED WITH STUDENTS BEING RESIDENTS OF BOSTON.

FOUR CASES WERE INVESTIGATED WITH SPECIAL PLACEMENTS.

>> WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

WHAT IS SPECIAL PLACEMENTS?

>> THEY WERE TUITION CASES, IN OTHER WORDS, THEY WERE OUT OF DISTRICT.

THEY WERE -- OUT OF DISTRICT PLACEMENTS.

TWO WERE INVESTIGATED WERE

HOMELESS ALLOWED TO STAY.

22 CASES WENT UNRESOLVED.

I WANT TO SORT OF CLARIFY THE 22 CASES THAT WENT UNRESOLVED.

WE GET LOT OF TIPS OR SUSPICION

OF FAMILIES THAT AREN'T

RESIDENTS BUT WE NEED A PHYSICAL ADDRESS.

SO IT'S NOT ENOUGH TO SAY, A

STUDENT SAID THAT THEY'RE LIVING IN BROCKTON OR THEY'RE TIRED BECAUSE THEY HAVE A LONG CAR RIDE.

WE NEED A PHYSICAL ADDRESS.
OFTENTIMES THAT BECOMES
CHALLENGING, WE DO NOT FOLLOW
CARS.

WE DON'T -- WE WILL -- THE INVESTIGATOR WILL, IF THEY HAVE SUSPICION THAT A FAMILY IS COMING FROM OUT OF THE DISTRICT THERE ARE OCCASIONS WHERE HE WILL LOOK AND WAIT FOR A CAR AND GET A LICENSE PLATE REGISTRATION AND RUN THE PLATE.

IT BECOMES TRICKY, WE NEED SOMETIMES MORE INFORMATION THAN WE GET.

>> LET ME JUST JUMP IN, THE PHYSICAL ADDRESS YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT IS AN ALTERNATIVE PHYSICAL ADDRESS, YOU'RE SAYING THAT YOU HAVE TO BE ABLE TO SAY THAT THEY DON'T LIVE IN BOSTON BUT THEY LIVE IN BROCKTON.

>> IT'S AN OBSERVATION.
IT BECOMES MATTER OF AN OBSERVATION.

WE'LL OBSERVE AND INVESTIGATE
THE RESIDENCE ON FILE BUT WE
ALSO, IF WE DON'T SEE FAMILY OR
STUDENTS COMING OUT OF THAT
RESIDENCE AND WE DON'T HAVE ANY
ALTERNATIVE ADDRESS WE'RE SORT
OF AT A LOSS.

>> IN THE YEAR BEFORE SCHOOL YEAR '15-16 IF I REMEMBER CORRECTLY THERE WERE 22 DISCHARGES FOR SCHOOL YEAR '15-16.

>> I DON'T HAVE THAT --WAS LOOKING FOR THAT EARLIER BUT I BELIEVE THAT'S THE NUMBER.

WE DO HAVE SIGNIFICANTLY MORE, ALMOST DOUBLE TO 4 DISCHARGE. TELL ME ABOUT THE FOUR THAT INVESTIGATED WITH SPECIAL PLACEMENT.

OUT OF DISTRICT, THE STUDENTS WHO LIVE OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT ARE PAYING TO ATTEND THE SCHOOL? >> NO.

WE DO NOT ALLOW THAT IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

THOSE WERE -- STUDENTS THAT WE PLACE FOR DISABILITIES GENERALLY SPEAKING, THEY GO TO OUR SCHOOL AND HAVE FOUND THAT BECAUSE OF THEIR DISABILITY, WE CAN'T MEET THEIR NEEDS SO THEY'RE GOING TO A SCHOOL OUTSIDE OF.

- >> THEN THEY SINCE MOVED OUT OF THE CITY BUT WE'RE STILL PAYING FOR THEM?
- >> NOT NECESSARILY, NO.
- >> I DON'T UNDERSTAND WHY THEY WOULD BE INVESTIGATED IF THEY WERE ATTENDING SCHOOL OUTSIDE OF THE DISTRICT.
- >> BECAUSE WE GOT INFORMATION TO SUGGEST -- IT'S JUST INFORMATION THAT WE FOLLOW UP ON.
- >> OKAY.
- SO IT COULD BE POSSIBLE THAT WE'RE PAYING NOR STUDENTS TO GET OUT OF DISTRICT PLACEMENT BECAUSE WE'RE NOT MEETING THEIR NEEDS IN THE CITY AND COULD BE SPECIAL NEEDS OR VOCATIONAL ED AND WHILE WE'RE PAYING FOR THEM TO ATTEND THIS OTHER SCHOOL THEY COULD MOVE OUT OF THE CITY WE DON'T HAVE THAT UPDATED INFORMATION AND WE'RE CONTINUING TO PAY FOR THEM.
- >> SO THERE WAS -- I KNOW THERE THERE WAS ONE PARTICULAR CASE COMES TO MIND AND THERE WERE TWO SIBLINGS.

THEY WERE FOUND TO LIVE IN BURLINGTON, YOU MIGHT KNOW THE PARTICULARS OF THIS, BUT IF WE GET INFORMATION TO SUGGEST THAT THEY ARE NOT LIVING THROUGH APRIL, WE HAVE TO -- IT HAS TO DO WITH SPECIAL ED PLACEMENTS AND IF WE GET INFORMATION BEFORE MAY WE ARE ON -- THIS IS ANY DISTRICT IS ON THE HOOK FOR THE FOLLOWING YEAR.

SO WE HAVE TO GET THAT INFORMATION BEFORE MAY.
DO YOU KNOW THE PARTICULARS OF THAT?

- >> I CAN GET THAT.
- >> I'M INTERESTED IN THAT.

>> WHAT ARE THE STUDENTS THAT WE WOULD PAY TO GO OUT OF DISTRICT? WE REIMBURSE THE RECEIVING SCHOOL DISTRICT.

SO SPECIAL ED, VOK ED.

>> THOSE ARE THE ONLY TWO.

>> WHAT ABOUT OUR STUDENTS THAT LIVE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON, ARE WE PAYING FOR THE RECEIVING SCHOOL DISTRICT?

>> NO.

>> I'M AM ALWAYS SORT OF CONCERNED ABOUT THIS MISMATCH BETWEEN NUMBER OF INVESTIGATORS WE HAVE ONE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

AND OTHER OUTSIDE DISTRICTS HAVE MORE.

CAN YOU TALK ABOUT SORT OF -THE TYPICAL CASES, I AM
CERTAINLY CONCERNED OF A STUDENT
EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS WE'RE
NOT DISCHARGING THEM THAT WE
PROTECT THEM UNDER FEDERAL AND
STATE LAW THAT WE SHOULD.
I OFTEN HEAR OF CASES OF THE
RESOURCES IS OFTEN WITH FAMILIES
THAT HAVE ASSETS, THAT HAVE
WEALTH THAT OWN MULTIPLE
PROPERTIES BOTH INSIDE AND
OUTSIDE OF THE CITY.
IS THERE SORT OF A PROFILE THAT

MIGHT FIT OR SEVERAL PROFILES
THAT MIGHT FIT OF THE TYPICAL
STUDENT OR FAMILY THAT IS
STARTING THE SYSTEM?

>> I DON'T THINK THAT THERE'S ANY PARTICULAR PROFILE.

I WILL SAY THAT I THINK A NUMBER OF STUDENTS START IN OUR DISTRICT AND PARENTS HAVE THE RESOURCES AND THEY DECIDE TO MOVE OUTSIDE OF AND CONTINUE TO ATTEND OUR SCHOOLS.

I DON'T KNOW IF IT'S A MATTER OF EDUCATING THEM THAT THEY THINK THAT THIS IS PERFECTLY OKAY. I CAN'T ANSWER THAT.

BUT I THINK THAT THAT'S MORE
THAN -- MORE OFTEN THE CASE.
MOST OF THE FAMILIES THAT ARE
STUDENTS THAT WE INVESTIGATE,
THE PARENTS CONTINUE TO OWN IN
THE CITY AND MAY HAVE

MULTI-FAMILY DWELLING OR EVEN SINGLE FAMILY HOMES.

THERE ARE SITUATIONS WHERE FAMILIES ARE LIVING WITH OTHER RELATIVES.

IT REALLY JUST RUNS THE GAM ULTIMATE.

>> I WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE COUNCILOR TIM McCARTHY WHO ALSO JOINED US.

JUST TO BE CLEAR, OUT OF THOSE NUMBERS DO YOU HAVE A BREAK DOWN OF THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS ATTENDING OUR TEST SCHOOLS? >> I DON'T.

NO.

>> IF YOU CAN GET THAT INFORMATION BECAUSE I WOULD LOVE TO UNDERSTAND IF THERE IS A DIFFERENCE IN TERMS THAT HAVE GROUP OF FOLKS.

ONE FROM THE REPORTING SIDE AND TWO FROM THE 43 DISMISSAL SIDE, I THINK THAT WOULD BE A CRITICAL DETERMINING FACTOR.

I ALSO THINK IF YOU CAN GET US INFORMATION ABOUT A LITTLE BIT MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THOSE OUT OF DISTRICT PLACEMENTS, BECAUSE TO MY KNOWLEDGE OUT OF DISTRICT PLACEMENTS CAN COST UP TO COUPLE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS A YEAR DEPENDING ON WHO AND WHERE THEY'RE GOING.

SO I THINK THERE'S -- FROM AN ACTUAL SAVINGS PERSPECTIVE WITH LIMITED RESOURCES I THINK THERE PROBABLY IS PRIORITY THERE IN TERMS OF THAT EXPENDITURE. IN ADDITION TO THE FACT THAT THOSE DOLLARS ARE ACTUALLY GOING OUT OF DISTRICT.

SO I THINK THAT THERE'S A COMPONENT THERE.

WHAT ARE WE DOING RELATIVE TO STUDENTS WHO ARE DISPLACED? WE HAVE MANY, BECAUSE OF THE ECONOMY IN WHICH WE LIVE IN THERE'S MANY CREATIVE WAYS THAT PEOPLE ARE LIVING IN BOSTON. WHAT IS THE DISTRICT DOING, ONE, TO MAKE SURE THAT THOSE ISSUES ARE INCORPORATED INTO THIS POLICY.

ALSO TO ASSIST THOSE FAMILIES IN ACTUALLY GETTING PERMANENT HOUSING.

>> I'LL JUST MAKE A STATEMENT AND TURN IT OVER TO YOU.
I THINK IN MY ROLE I HAVE SORT OF UNIQUE PERSPECTIVE IN THAT I WORK WITH A LOT OF DIFFERENT CITY AGENCIES AND NONPROFITS AND SO IF THERE ARE FAMILIES THAT COME TO MY ATTENTION, I AM MORE THAN HAPPY AND WILLING AND OFTEN DO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS OR CONNECT PEOPLE WITH DIFFERENT RESOURCES.

WE HAVE ON A NUMBER OF OCCASIONS WORKED WITH THE OFFICE OF HOUSING STABILITY UNDER DND.
I'VE BEEN ABLE TO -- I KNOW FOR A FACT PLACE THREE FAMILIES WITH THEM AND GET THEM HOUSING SO THAT'S SOMETHING THAT I'VE BEEN ABLE TO DO.

BUT MONICA, WHY DON'T YOU COMMENT.

>> YES, I THINK PART OF THE REASON WHY WE'RE STILL REALLY LOOKING AT THE OPTION, IS THAT WE ARE CONSIDERING IS BECAUSE WE WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT IN OUR SHIFTS WE DON'T NEGATIVELY IMPACT THE FAMILIES.

AS WE'RE MOVING FORWARD WE'RE LOOKING AT THAT, SHARING THAT WE'RE NOT HARMING ANY SET OF FAMILIES.

IN TERMS OF THE RESOURCES AND HOW WE'RE ATTENDING ONE OF THE THINGS IS THAT FAMILIES HAVE GREATEST CONNECTION WITH THEIR SCHOOL NOT AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL.

SO WE WANT TO MAKE SURE OFTEN OUR SCHOOL NURSES ARE FIRST ONES TO OUR HEARING, SOME FOLKS AS WELL AS TEACHERS, WE TRY TO MAKE SURE THAT THEY HAVE INFORMATION, WE HAVE WHAT WE CALL AN ASSET MAP THAT WE LAUNCH LAST YEAR WHICH IS ON OUR DISTRICT WE WEBSITE.

WHERE FOLKS CAN LOOK AT WHAT ARE RESOURCES BY NEIGHBORHOOD. SO IF I AM A SCHOOLTEACHER OR A

SCHOOL LEADER I'M NOT SURE WHAT IS IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD THAT THAT FAMILY IS IN I CAN USE THAT AS ONE RESOURCE.

WE ALSO HAVE OFFICE OF HOMELESS EDUCATION RESOURCE NETWORK, WHICH ARE THERE TO SERVE OUR HOMELESS FAMILIES, DO SUPPORT AND WRITE UP INFORMATION TO ANY OF OUT FAMILIES WHO ARE EXPERIENCING ANY CHALLENGES. SO THEY'RE OFTEN ABLE TO DIRECT FAMILIES TO -- PROVIDE THE SCHOOL SUPPLIES AND RESOURCES TO HELP DIRECTED THEM TO PROGRAMMING WITHIN A COMMUNITY, TO DIRECT THEM TO WORK ON HOUSING.

I THINK ONE OF THE EXCITING
THINGS THAT WE'RE IN THE PROCESS
OF DOING BECAUSE OF THE INFLUX
OF FAMILIES COMING IN FROM
PUERTO RICO WE HAVE BEEN WORKING
ACROSS THE CITY TO BRING IN
ORGANIZATIONS IN THE COMMUNITY
WHO ARE SERVING FAMILIES TO
THINK HOW WE COLLABORATIVELY
BEGIN TO THINK ABOUT SUPPORT FOR
FAMILIES.

AND PART OF OUR CONVERSATION IS HOW DO WE DEAL WITH HOUSING BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT THERE ARE CHALLENGES WITH HOUSING IN THE CITY, SO THAT GROUP ACTUALLY IN THE PROCESS OF TRYING TO IDENTIFY A FRAMEWORK FOR WHAT IT WOULD LOOK LIKE FOR INTERAGENCY SORT OF PROCESS OF PROVIDING CASE MANAGEMENT AND SUPPORT FOR OUR FAMILIES WHO MOST NEED IT. >> I THINK THAT'S CRITICAL. BECAUSE ACTUALLY.

>> WHEN HE BECAME CHAIR THERE WERE 1500 HOMELESS STUDENTS. NOW THERE'S 4,000.

SO I THINK REALLY A
THOUGHT-PROVOKING IDEA TO BEGIN
TO THINK ABOUT HOW THE DISTRICT
WHICH HAS ONE OF THE DEEPEST
CONNECTIONS WITH FAMILIES IN THE
CITY OF BOSTON PREVENTS HO
HOMELESSNESS.

IS IT AN EARLY INDICATOR, SERVES AS RESOURCE IN TERMS OF HOW WE

CAN THINK ABOUT SOME OF THESE ISSUES.

IT'S MUCH CHEAPER TO PAY ONE MONTH OF BACK RENT THAN TO HAVE SOMEBODY IN THE HOMELESSNESS SYSTEM.

SO I THINK THERE'S SOMETHING THAT WE SHOULD BEGIN TO THINK ABOUT THERE.

>> I'D LIKE TO ADD ALSO, TOO, THAT THE OFFICE OF SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL WELLNESS RECEIVED, I BELIEVE IT WAS \$1.2 MILLION GRANT SPECIFICALLY TARGETED TO THIS ISSUE.

IT ALLOWED SOME OF OUR SCHOOLS WITH HIGH NEED POPULATION TO ACTUALLY HIRE A HOMELESS RESOURCE SPECIALIST.

I DON'T KNOW WHAT THOSE ->> I THINK BIGGEST ISSUE THAT WE
HAVE, I'M ONLY GOING TO SPEAK IN
MY DISTRICT IS THAT THE
RESOURCES ARE TAPPED OUT.
AND SO I GUESS THE QUESTION
WOULD BE, WOULD SOME OF THOSE
DOLLARS BE EVEN BETTER USED
DIRECTING THEM TOWARDS THOSE
FAMILIES BECAUSE WE GET CALLS
EVERY DAY THAT ARE DEALING WITH
THIS.

ONE COMPONENT AROUND RESIDENCY PIECE THAT I ALSO WANTED TO KNOW, WE ACTUALLY DID -- I WAS PART OF THE COMMITTEE THAT LOOKED AT RESIDENCY RELATIVE TO POLICE AT BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS HOW MANY INVESTIGATORS DO YOU HAVE ON THAT FRONT?

>> WE DON'T.

WE DON'T DO EMPLOYEE INVESTIGATION.

- >> WHO DOES THAT?
- >> THE CITY OF BOSTON DOES.
- >> OKAY.
- >> THE CITY, THROUGH THE OFFICE OF HUMAN RESOURCES.
- >> OKAY.

HOW OFTEN DOES THE CITY EXPLORE ITS OWN AS A DEPARTMENT, DO YOU EXPLORE YOUR OWN CL CLASSIFICATIONS, ONE OF THE ISSUES THAT WE HAD WERE THAT THERE WERE MANY PEOPLE WHO WERE ACTUALLY LIVING OUT OF THE CITY,
ACTUALLY SOME -- I THINK ONE
TURNED OUT TO BE A SPOUSE, BUT
WHEN IT COMES DOWN TO THIS ISSUE
HOW HAS THE BOSTON PUBLIC
SCHOOLS EXPLORED ITS OWN
EMPLOYEES RELATIVE TO THIS ISSUE
OF RESIDENCY?

>> SO, I CAN SPEAK TO THAT
BECAUSE I'VE BEEN WORKING WITH
THE -- OUR DIRECTOR OF HUMAN
CAPITAL AS WELL AS OUR LEGAL
ADVISOR HE'S OFFICE ON THIS
ISSUE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE
CITY HUMAN RESOURCE DEPARTMENT
AND, I FORGET THE COMMISSION.
>> RESIDENCY COMMISSION, AND
FRANK DOYLE WE HAVE A MEETING
TOMORROW, BUT WE HAVE BEEN
REFINING AND WORKING VERY, VERY
CLOSELY WITH THE CITY ON THIS
PARTICULAR ISSUE.

AND WHAT COMPLICATES THIS ISSUE FOR US AND HAS IS THE NUMBER OF UNIONS AND THE COMPLEXITY OF JOB TITLES AND NOT NECESSARILY FITTING INTO SPECIFIC BOXES. SO WE HAVE SPENT THE LAST SIX MONTHS GOING OVER EVERYTHING WITH A FINE TOOTH COMB. WE HAVE, I BELIEVE, PUT CLASSIFIED OUR EMPLOYEES INTO THREE BIG BUCKETS AND CERTAINLY THERE ARE SOME THAT ARE EXEMPT BUT THOSE THAT ARE NOT EXEMPT FROM THE RESIDENCY WE HAVE BEEN LOOKING VERY CLOSELY. WE'RE PRETTY CLOSE TO GETTING EVERYTHING --

>> BECAUSE DURING THE PROCESS, BPS DID STAND OUT AS A DEPARTMENT THAT ACTUALLY DID NOT HAVE THE INFORMATION THAT WE NEEDED.

I ALSO THINK AS WE HAVE THESE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT ENFORCEMENT OF FAMILIES THERE ARE IN THE DISTRICT I THINK IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS LOOK AT ITSELF IN THE MIRROR RELATIVE TO ITS OWN ENFORCEMENT OF THE EMPLOYEES THAT ARE SUPPOSED TO BE LIVING

IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

I JUST WANT TO SAY YOU DO A GREAT JOB WITH VERY LITTLE RESOURCES AND YOU OF COURSE ARE ON SPEED DIAL IN THE McCARTHY COUNCIL CHAMBER, I WANT TO THANK YOU ABOVE AND BEYOND, WE APPRECIATE THAT.

I KNOW YOU'VE GOT THOUSAND THINGS ON YOUR PLATE.

I REALLY JUST CAME TO SAY THANKS TO BE HONEST WITH YOU.

>> THANK YOU.

ONE MORE QUESTION.

SO I GUESS I MISSTATED HOW I'D LIKE THE BREAK OUT OF THOSE CASES.

CAN YOU DO THEM BY SCHOOL?

>> YES.

>> INSTEAD OF JUST TEST SCHOOLS I THINK WAIT BE REALLY HELPFUL.

>> I ACTUALLY HAVE NUMBERS YEAR TO DATE.

>> AWESOME.

THE 108 WAS THE PRIOR YEAR.

>> YES.

>> WHAT IS YEAR TO DATE THIS YEAR?

>> THIS IS -- SO THIS YEAR, '17-18.

THROUGH DECEMBER 5th WE HAVE

38 CASES, WHICH I LOOKED AT THE

NUMBERS AT ABOUT THIS TIME LAST

YEAR WE WERE PRETTY MUCH ON PAR,

SAME -- AROUND THE SAME NUMBER.

TEN STUDENTS HAVE BEEN

DISCHARGED THUS FAR THIS YEAR.

SIX STUDENTS WERE RESOLVED WITH

FINDING THAT STUDENTS WERE IN

FACT RESIDENTS OF BOSTON.

FOUR STUDENTS INVESTIGATED WERE

LISTED AS HOMELESS, I KNOW THREE

OF THOSE FOUR WERE SIBLINGS, AS

IS OFTEN THE CASE.

RIGHT NOW WE HAVE 18 ACTIVE

CASES UNDER INVESTIGATION.
AND SOME OF THESE TAKE LONGER
THAN OTHERS.

THERE'S NO SORT OF AVERAGE IN TERMS OF THE INVESTIGATORY PROCESS.

AND THERE ARE CASES THAT SORT OF, WE LOOK AND FOLLOW AND TRACK FROM ONE YEAR TO THE NEXT BECAUSE THERE IS SUSPICION BUT WE DON'T QUITE HAVE ALL OF THE INFORMATION.

A LOT OF THIS IS IN FLUX. >> DO WE DO ANYTHING -- IDENTIFY THOSE STUDENTS ARE HOMELESS, THEY'RE HOMELESS AND WE JUST KEEP GOING OR IS THERE ANY INTERVENTION COMPONENT THAT OCCURRED RELATIVE TO THAT HOMELESS POPULATION RECEIVING ANY RESOURCES TO HELP? >> SO FOR OUR PIECE REGARDING THE INVESTIGATION, WE CLOSE THAT CASE BUT WE ALWAYS MAKE SURE TO FOLLOW UP WITH THE SCHOOL. WE GENERALLY LEAVE IT UP TO THE SCHOOL TO SUPPORT THOSE FAMILIES.

CONNECTION, MONICA JUST BROUGHT
IT UP, THIS IS THE DISCONNECT IN
GOVERNMENT AND I BELIEVE ALSO IN
BPS RIGHT HERE SO YOU'VE
IDENTIFIED VULNERABLE
POPULATION, YOU PROBABLY
INJECTED SOME TRAUMA BECAUSE
THEY'RE GETTING INVESTIGATED.
AND THEY'RE ALREADY HOMELESS.
SO I GUESS THE QUESTION WOULD
BE, WITH THAT INFORMATION WHICH
IS REALLY IMPORTANT, WHAT ARE WE
DOING TO ACTUALLY HELP THAT
FAMILY?

I JUST THINK THERE'S A CONNECTION THAT SHOULD OCCUR THAT WOULD ACTUALLY HELP IN THAT REGARD.

AND ALSO TO ASSESS WHAT TYPES OF RESOURCES ARE NEEDED FOR THOSE FAMILIES.

RESOURCE NETWORK OFFICE.

ON WHAT'S AVAILABLE THERE,
CERTAIN AMOUNT OF SORT THEY
PROVIDE, CERTAINLY WELL EQUIPPED
TO PROVIDE SUPPORT AROUND
TRAUMA.

OFTEN THEN FAMILIES TO THAT OFFICE OR ALL OF THE OTHER NEEDS INCLUDING CLOSING.

- >> IN BOSTON LATIN ACADEMY.
- >> BUT IT'S A PART OF THE CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION.
- >> YES.
- >> CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION HAS
 INFORMATION AND WE'RE PUSHING IT
 BACK TO THE SCHOOL TO COME BACK
 TO THE CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION,
 ALL I'M SAYING THAT WE HAVE THAT
 INFORMATION AND YOU HAVE
 EXTENSIVE, I'M ASSUMING THAT THE
 INVESTIGATOR DOES REALLY GOOD
 JOB THEY HAVE THE NAME AND
 FAMILY ALL THAT OTHER STUFF.
 WE GOT TO CUT THE RED TAPE,
 THESE ARE VULNERABLE
 POPULATIONS, WE'VE DETERMINED
 THEY LIVE IN BOSTON AND THEY'RE
 HOMELESS.
- I JUST THINK THAT THAT'S --THAT'S ONE OTHER QUESTION I HAVE
- ON THE HOMELESSNESS SIDE OF THINGS, THEY DON'T ACTUALLY HAVE TO LIVE IN THE CITY, CORRECT? >> THEY'RE OFTEN NOT --AT'S THE OTHER COMPONENT THERE.
- AND JUST FOR THE RECORD, SOMEONE WHO IS HOMELESS IN THE STATE OF MASSACHUSETTS IS AFFORDED THE RIGHT TO HAVE THEIR CHILD GO TO THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND HAVE NO BREAK IN THEIR EDUCATION EVEN IF THEY ARE HOUSED OUTSIDE OF THE CITY OF BOSTON BASED ON OUR CURRENT FEDERAL AND STATE GUIDANCE OR AROUND THOSE ISSUES. COUNCILOR?
- >> I ACTUALLY LIKE IF YOU LIKE RESPONDING TO SOME OF THE CONCERNS OF THE WORK THAT HIVE BEEN ABLE TO DO OVER THE LAST

24, 2 AND HALF MONTHS OR SO.
WE HAVE PRETTY INCREDIBLE
WORKING GROUP THAT CONNECTED
NUMBER OF SCHOOLS IN THE
DISTRICT THAT HAVE HIGHER
PREVALENCE OF STUDENTS WHO ARE
EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS WITH
HOUSING SUPPORTS AS WELL AS SOME
COMMUNITY SUPPORT.

THAT SORT OF LOOK AND ANALYSIS OF THE WAY WE ARE SUPPORTING FAMILIES WHO ARE EITHER EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS OR AT RISK OF EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IS INCREDIBLE FOR ME TO BE ABLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THAT WORK.

I'D ALSO SHARE THAT THE 1.2
MILLION DOLLARS IS ACTUALLY NOT
AT ALL IN THE CENTRAL OFFICE, IT
HAS ALL BEEN SENT OUT TO THE
SCHOOLS AND PART OF THE SORT OF
WAY THE STUDENT FORMULA SIMILAR
TO THAT DISTRIBUTES TO THE
SCHOOL TO SUPPORT THE WORK
THAT'S HAPPENING AT THE SCHOOL
LEVEL BECAUSE WE KNOW THAT
THAT'S WHERE OUR STUDENTS ARE
AND THEIR FAMILIES ARE OFTEN
ONLY CONNECTED TO THE SCHOOL
COMMUNITIES.

SO THAT WORK IS PRETTY POWERFUL AND IMPORTANT AND I'M HAPPY THAT WE'RE DOING IT OF COURSE ALWAYS LOOKING TO DO MORE OF IT. BUT BACK TO SOME OF THE STUDENT RESIDENCY QUESTIONS THAT I HAVE, PARTICULARLY TO THE POLICY AND WORK THAT YOU'RE DOING AROUND ENSURING THAT OUR STUDENTS AND OUR SCHOOLS ARE BOSTON KIDS. HOW MUCH MONEY -- HOW MUCH HAVE WE ENVISIONED FOR THE SERVICES, WE CAN EITHER GO TO DATE OR BY SCHOOL YEAR, HOW MUCH HAS BEEN ENVISIONED HOW MUCH HAVE -- I HAVE TO GET YOU THOSE NUMBERS. I DIDN'T HAVE CHANCE TO DO THAT BUT I WILL GET YOU THOSE NUMBERS.

>> DO WE INVOICE FOR SERVICES AND HOW DO WE COME UP WITH THAT DOLLAR AMOUNT?

>> WE INVOICE STUDENTS THAT WE

DISCHARGE.

WE DETERMINED THAT WE WERE GOING TO INVOICE FROM THE TIME THAT WE GET THE TIP.

BECAUSE WE LOOKED AT THIS WITH THE OFFICE OF THE LEGAL ADVISOR AND WE HAD NO OTHER WAY OF DETERMINING REALLY WHEN WE SHOULD INVOICE.

WE THOUGHT THAT WE WOULD IN JOYCE FROM THE TIME THAT WE GET THE TIP.

>> BUT MIGHT BE DOCUMENTED THAT THE STUDENT DIDN'T LIVE IN THE CITY SINCE SEPTEMBER 1st BUT WE'LL GO FROM TODAY.

EASIER TO -- IS IT -- DO WE DO THAT BECAUSE IT'S EASIER TO SEND LEGALLY?

>> YES.

GO AHEAD.

>> SORRY.

THEN ON THE COLLECTION.

>> THEN WHAT WE -- THE AMOUNT IS DETERMINED, WE USE THE PER PUPIL EXPENDITURE THAT WE REIMBURSE TO CHARTER SCHOOLS, WHICH IS PER PUPIL EXPENDITURE, WE BACK OUT TRANSPORTATION AND SPECIAL EDUCATION COST.

LAST YEAR IT WAS LIKE 8671 PER DIEM.

I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE FIGURE IS OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD.

>> PER YEAR.

>> PER DAY.

ROUGHLY \$86 PER DAY.

>> OKAY.

>> LIKE 86 AND CHANGE.

THEN WE DETERMINE THE NUMBER OF DAYS THAT THEY HAVE BEEN IN ATTENDANCE THEN WE SEND THE INVOICE.

>> I WOULD BE INTERESTED IN WHAT WE'VE INVOICED, WHAT WE'VE RECEIVED BACK, BECAUSE IT'S MY UNDERSTANDING THAT WE HAVE ACTUALLY RECEIVED SOME PAYMENT FROM FAMILIES THAT HAVE BEEN DISCHARGED.

I ALSO KNOW THAT ONE OF THE PLACES WHERE WE RUN INTO DIFFICULTY IS PROVING THE CENTER OF LIFE FOR STUDENTS.

SO A STUDENT CAN IN FACT LIVE OUTSIDE THE CITY BUT DEMONSTRATE THAT THE CENTER OF THEIR LIFE IS IN THE CITY AND ATTEND ONE OF OUR SCHOOLS.

>> I THINK THE COMPLEXITIES OF FAMILIES HAS CHANGED AND NOT EVERY SINGLE CASE THAT WE GET IS ABSOLUTELY CUT AND DRY.

AND WE CAN TRY OUR LEVEL BEST TO GET AS MUCH INFORMATION THAT WE CAN AND FRANKLY WE GIVE -- WE CAN DISCHARGE AND FAMILIES HAVE THE RIGHT OF APPEAL WITHIN TEN DAYS AND WHEN THEY APPEAL THEY HAVE TO GIVE IT THEIR BEST SHOT. SO THEY HAVE TO PROVIDE AS MUCH COMPELLING INFORMATION AND EVIDENCE AS POSSIBLE.

AND OFTENTIMES THEY'RE ABLE TO DO SO AND DEMONSTRATE LIKE YOU SAID, THAT THEY'RE INVOLVED IN THE COMMUNITY AND THEY SPEND A TREMENDOUS AMOUNT OF TIME IN THAT COMMUNITY.

IT GETS VERY TRICKY.

THEIR LIFE --

RESIDENCE.

>> NOW, OF THE 37 CASES THAT WERE RESOLVED LAST SCHOOL YEAR, THOSE ARE RESOLVED MEANING THE STUDENT EITHER HAS DETERMINED LEGITIMATE RESIDENCY OR IS DETERMINED LEGITIMATE RESIDENCY THAT IS CENTER OF LIFE.

MAY NOT SLEEP IN THE CITY ANY NIGHT OF THE WEEK BUT THEY HAVE DETERMINED THAT THE CENTER OF

>> A LOT OF TIMES, TOO, WE'RE FINDING IT'S CUSTODIAL.
SO ONE PARENT MAY LIVE IN THE CITY AND ONE PARENT MAY LIVE IN A NEIGHBORING TOWN AND THAT CHILD ACTUALLY SPENDS EQUIVALENT AMOUNTS OF TIME IN EITHER

THERE'S A LOT OF BACK AND FORTH BETWEEN RESIDENCE WITH CHILDREN. >> ONE OF THE PARTS OF THAT THAT FRUSTRATES ME IS WHEN IT'S NOT CUSTODIAL ISSUE, THAT IT'S GRANDPARENTS OR UNCLES AND AUNTS AND SIMPLY THE DROPPING OFF OR PICKING UP SPOT THAT BECOMES REALLY FRUSTRATING AS A PARENT.

I KNOW WHEN MY BOY PLAYED LITTLE LEAGUE THE -- LITTLE LEAGUE RULES ARE SO RESTRICTED OF WHO CAN PLAY IN WHICH LITTLE LEAGUE PROGRAM IN THE STATE OF MASSACHUSETTS OR IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

AND FOR MY BOYS TO PLAY FOR THEIR LITTLE LEAGUE PROGRAM THEY HAVE TO DEMONSTRATE THAT THEY EITHER LIVE IN THAT DISTRICT, WHICH IS OUTLINED BY BOUNDARIES, OR GO TO SCHOOL IN THAT DISTRICT, WHICH IS OUTLINED BY BOUNDARIES.

IT'S VERY SIMPLE.

I HAVE TO ALL BUT GIVE A BLOOD SAMPLE IN ORDER TO PROVE THAT.
AND IF I CAN'T DEMONSTRATE IT MY KID CAN'T PLAY BASEBALL.
BASEBALL IS A GREAT SPORT BUT FOR OUR KIDS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON AND FOR ME AS A CITY COUNCILOR IT'S MY JOB TO MAKE CITY OF BOSTON AND FOR ME AS A CITY COUNCILLOR, IT'S MY JOB TO GIVE OUR CITY RESIDENTS ACCESS TO CITY SCHOOLS.

WHEN I UNDERSTAND THAT THERE IS JUST THIS GRAY AREA THAT IS SO FRUSTRATING.

IT'S UPSETTING TO ME AND MAKES ME REALLY FRUSTRATED ABOUT THIS POLICY.

>> SO I WILL SAY THAT THAT'S WHEN WE REALLY RELY ON THE OBSERVATION PIECE OF THIS. WE ARE DOING I THINK A MUCH BETTER JOB AT DOING MORE OBSERVATIONS OVER A LONGER PERIOD OF TIME AND TAKING OUR TIME WITH THESE.

SO THEY ARE A LOT LESS ABLE TO PUNCH HOLES IN IT.

SO WE HAVE DISCHARGED STUDENTS WHERE A PARENT WAS LIVING OUTSIDE AND GOING TO A RELATIVE'S OR SOME OTHER HOUSE INSIDE CITY BOUNDARIES AND DROPPING THAT CHILD OFF AT THE BUS STOP.

SO WE -- I THINK THAT'S WHEN THE OBSERVATIONS BECOME SUPER IMPORTANT.

>> ONE COMPLICATING FACTOR, WE HAVE A LOT OF WHAT WE CALL KINSHIP FAMILY STRUCTURES. WHERE YOU HAVE GRANDPARENTS THAT ARE RAISING THEIR GRANDCHILDREN. VERY OFTEN WITHOUT CUSTODIALSHIP AT ALL.

THEY'RE FEEDING THEM, LIVING WITH THEM, DOING EVERYTHING BUT MOM STILL COMES IN.

THEY'RE RESIDING WITH THEIR GRANDPARENTS.

ONE OF THE THINGS WE HAVE TO DO IS HELP FAMILIES UNDERSTAND THE KIND OF -- THE PIECES -- POLICY PIECES AND IMPLICATIONS FOR THE FAMILY -- AND HOW THAT IMPACTS THEIR FAMILY STRUCTURES.
THEY'RE TRYING TO STRUCTURE THEMSELVES TO SUPPORT THE YOU ANY AND THE REALITIES OF THE SYSTEM.

I SPEAK FROM EXPERIENCE.
MY MOTHER AND FATHER RAISED MY
NIECES AND NEPHEWS AND THEY HAD
CUSTODY OF ONE AND NOT THE
OTHER.

WE HAVE TO FIGURE OUT HOW TO DO THAT WORK.

>> MY CHALLENGE IS THE FAMILY OUTSIDE THE CITY, BOTH PARENTS HAVE PROFESSIONAL JOBS, MULTIPLE CARS REGISTERED TO THE HOUSE OUTSIDE THE CITY, YET EVERY MORNING THEY GET DROPPED OFF AT A BUS AND ADDRESS AND GOES OFF TO ANYONE OF OUR SCHOOLS, BE IT AN EXAM SCHOOL OR NOT AN EXAM SCHOOL, A SPECIAL ED PROGRAM, A K-1 SEAT THAT IS SO AVAILABLE. AT THE END OF THE DAY, THEY RETURN TO THE GRANDPARENTS HOME. THE PARENT PICKS THEM UP AND THEY DRIVE BACK OFF TO THE SUBURBS.

THEY GET THE BEST OF BOTH WORLDS.

THAT'S WHERE IT COMES DOWN TO.

IT SO OFTEN -- IT'S SO

FRUSTRATING WHEN SO OFTEN IT'S

FAMILIES OF WEALTH OR MEANS THAT

CAN PICK AND CHOOSE.

NAME THE SUBJECTION SCHOOL IS NOT

NAH, THE SUBURBAN SCHOOL IS NOT ALL IT CRACKED UP TO BE.

BUT THEY GOT INTO THE LATIN SCHOOL OR THIS $K\!-\!0$ OR FULL-TIME KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM.

SO GRANDMA AND GRANDPA STILL LIVE IN THE CITY.

WE CAN MAKE IT WORK BECAUSE WE HAVE MEANS.

IT'S FRUSTRATING TO WASH, ESPECIALLY AS OUR

RESPONSIBILITIES ARE FRUSTRATING AND PROTECT THE INTERESTS OF OUR RESIDENTS.

THAT'S THE END OF IT FOR ME. THANK YOU.

>> JUST TO CONTINUE ON WITH THAT.

I THINK IT IS A CREDIT TO THE GREAT WORK THAT THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE DOING.

I THINK WE NEED TO LOOK AT IT IN THAT REGARD ALSO, THAT THESE ARE HIGHLY SOUGHT AFTER SEATS.

PEOPLE ARE WILLING BY HOOK OR CROOK TO DO WHATEVER THEY THINK THEY NEED TO DO TO GET FOLKS IN.

SO I THINK THERE'S A -- AS THE BPS GETS HIT SO OFTEN, THERE ARE PEOPLE THAT ARE WILLING TO CONTORT THEMSELVES, THEIR LIVES

AND THEIR TRANSPORTATION AND GET THEIR CHILDREN INTO THESE CLASSROOMS.

SO I JUST THINK WE NEED TO PUT THAT COMPONENT ALSO IN PERSPECTIVE AS OTHER

PERSPECTIVE AS OTHER
ORGANIZATIONS BRING UP WAITING
LISTS AND THE LIKE WHILE WE HAVE
THE SAME.

THIS SHOWS THAT.

HOW LONG DOES A CASE STAY UNRESOLVED?

>> I DON'T REALLY HAVE AN ANSWER.

>> I'M SAYING, IS THERE A -THERE MUST BE A CUT-OFF THAT
SAYS THIS CASE GETS CLASSIFIED
IN THE PARKING LOT OVER HERE,
RIGHT?

HOW DO YOU --

>> UNLESS -- SO WE WORK CLOSELY WITH THE SCHOOL.

UNLESS WE -- YOU KNOW, THERE ARE TIMES WHEN WE'LL GET ADDITIONAL INFORMATION.

AND THERE ARE JUST SOME OF THOSE CASES THAT SORT OF RISE TO THE TOP WHERE WE KNOW OR WE HAVE A HIGH SUSPICION THAT WE'RE BEING GAMED.

WE'LL FOLLOW THOSE.

I CAN'T GIVE YOU A HARD AND FAST TIME FRAME.

BUT WE DO FOLLOW -- WE FOLLOW THOSE CASES, PARTICULARLY WHEN THERE ARE MULTIPLE SIBLINGS OR WE SEE OTHER SIBLINGS COMING IN. >> SO HOW MANY CARRY-OVERS FROM LAST YEAR?

>> SO I WOULD SAY 22 CASES THAT WENT UNRESOLVED, I'M NOT SURE IF THOSE ARE -- I COULD FIND OUT. CARRY-OVERS.

I DON'T HAVE THAT.

>> OKAY.

I'D LIKE THAT -- FROM WHAT YOU WERE JUST SAYING, I -- I GUESS IT WOULD BE INTERESTING TO HEAR HOW MANY OF THOSE ARE CARRY-OVERS AND HOW MANY OF THOSE ACTUALLY ARE DETERMINED TO BE IMPROPERLY IN THE SCHOOLS. WHEN THERE'S AN APPEAL, YOU SAID THERE'S A TEN-DAY APPEAL PROCESS.

WHO DOES THE APPEAL GO TO AND WHO ADJUDICATES THAT?

>> SO WE -- WE HAVE A RESIDENCY REVIEW COMMITTEE.

WE MEET WEEKLY.

WE REVIEW CASES.

IT'S A CROSS SECTION OF PEOPLE FROM THE DISTRICT.

WHEN A FAMILY APPEALS, THEY HAVE TEN DAYS TO DO SO.

THEY PUT IT IN WRITING AND THEY PROVIDE INFORMATION, MORE INFORMATION TO PROVE RESIDENCY.

IT GOES BEFORE -- AGAIN GOES BEFORE THE RESIDENCY REVIEW COMMITTEE.

IT'S REVIEWED -- THAT DECISION IS REVIEWED BY THE CHIEF OF STAFF AS WELL.

AND THEN THE FINAL DETERMINATION IS MADE.

>> IS THERE -- ARE THERE ANY TIMES IN WHICH BPS MEETS WITH THE CITY RESIDENCY BOARD IN ORDER TO DETERMINE BEST PRACTICES OR STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES?

THERE'S SOMETHING THAT COULD BE GAINED BY KIND OF -- IN THE MEDICAL FIELD, THEY DO AN MMR AND LOOK BACK AT A CASE AND PEOPLE FROM DIFFERENT SPECIALTIES LOOK AT IT. IS THERE ANY KIND OF CROSS POLLINIIZATION OF WHAT HAPPENS? >> WE HAVE HAVEN'T CONVENED, BUT WE'VE HAD REGULAR CONVERSATIONS WITH THEM.

>> I WOULD SUGGEST YOU'RE DOING THE SAME WORK, AND I THINK IT WOULD BE REALLY INTERESTING TO LOOK AT THE MANNER WHICH THE WORK IS DONE FROM BOTH FRONTS. ANY SUCCESSES KIND OF BASELINES A STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE THAT YOU HAVE.

BEST PRACTICES ACROSS THE BOARD. I THINK THAT WOULD MAKE A LOT OF SENSE IN ORDER TO BECOME BETTER AND MORE NIMBLE AT THIS AND CONSIDERING YOU'RE ACTUALLY DOING THE SAME WORK.

COUNCILLOR?

>> I APPRECIATE YOUR TIME TODAY. I THANK YOU, CHAIR, FOR GETTING THIS MEETING --

>> AND THIS IS -- I THINK WITH LIMITED RESOURCES AND WE'VE SEEN THAT MORE AND MORE LATELY, THAT OUR SCHOOLS ARE NOT FUNDED AT THE LEVEL THAT THIGH SHOULD BE. THEY'RE UNDERFUNDED.

TO HAVE RESOURCES WORKING OUT THE DOOR AND I THINK TO COUNCILLOR ESSAIBI-GEORGE'S -- LISTEN, IF YOU'RE LIVING IN A VERY AFFLUENT NEIGHBORHOOD OUTSIDE THE CITY OF BOSTON AND YOU'RE DROPPING FOLKS OFF, THAT'S ONE OF THE THINGS THAT WE MOST -- MOST HURTS US.
THE OTHER COMPONENT IS WE KNOW THAT WE LIVE IN THE CITY OF BOSTON THAT IS BASED ON THE COST OF LIVING HERE.

PUSHING A LOT OF FOLKS OUT. ACTUALLY MEANING THAT BEING DOMICILED OR LIVING SOMEPLACE MEANS SOMETHING TOTALLY DIFFERENT TODAY THAN THREE YEARS AGO.

LOOKS DIFFERENT.

THE TYPES OF SHARING THAT HAVE
TO GO ON RIGHT NOW TO BE ABLE TO
STAY IN THE CITY ARE -- IT'S
JUST REALLY STRETCHING OUR
IMAGINATION RELATIVE TO THAT.
I THINK IT'S INCUMBENT ON US NOT
ONLY TO CHRONICLE THIS
INFORMATION AND JUST GET THE
DATA.

WE'RE DEALING WITH PEOPLE.
IT'S REALLY CRITICAL THAT WE
ACTUALLY TAKE THAT DATA AND USE
IT, OPERATIONALIZE IT AND HELP
THE PEOPLE IN NEED.

ALSO, PROACTIVELY HOW DO WE GET AHEAD OF THIS.

BECAUSE -- SO THERE ARE PEOPLE, YES THAT ARE GAMING THE SYSTEM AND THEY HAVE A BUNCH OF DOUGH. THERE'S A BUNCH OF OTHER FOLKS HAVE TO THINK ABOUT HOW THEY KEEP THEIR CHILDREN IN SCHOOLS BASED ON THEIR ISSUES RELATIVE TO SOCIOECONOMIC STATUS, CLASS AND WHETHER OR NOT THEY'RE CONSIDERED HOMELESS BASED ON THE STATE DEFINITION.

SO THERE'S A HUGE OPPORTUNITY WITH A VULNERABLE POPULATION HERE TO HELP MOVE THE DIAL IN THIS SPACE.

WE WILL NOW ASK FOR PUBLIC TESTIMONY.

ARE THERE ANY INDIVIDUALS THAT WOULD LIKE TO TESTIFY?

IN YOU COULD IDENTIFY YOURSELF. YOU KNOW WHAT?

THOSE ARE NEW.

WE'RE GOING TO SEE IF THEY WORK TODAY.

YOU CAN IDENTIFY YOURSELF FOR THE RECORD.

I KNOW THIS IS THE FIRST TIME YOU'VE BEEN AT COUNCIL.

>> MY NAME IS ILENE BOYLE.

I'M ONE OF THE MEMBERS --

>> OKAY.

>> CAN YOU LEAN IN A LITTLE BIT?

>> HELLO?

>> THERE YOU GO.

I'M ILENE BOYLE.

I'M ONE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE RESIDENCY COMPLIANCE COMMITTEE UNDER THE SAVE OUR CITY MEMBERSHIP.

I WANT TO STATE THIS HAS BEEN A LONG, PAINFUL ISSUE, ESPECIALLY AS A PARENT.

AND SEEING A FATHER 20 YEARS AGO IN WEST ROXBURY LITERALLY CRY BECAUSE HE FOUND OUT HIS DAUGHTERS DIDN'T GET INTO THE EXAM SCHOOLS AND FOUND OUT THE SEATS WERE STOLEN BY PEOPLE OUTSIDE THE CITY.

IT WAS A PINNACLE MOMENT FOR ME 20 YEARS AGO.

I KNOW CAROLINE IS WORKING EXTREMELY HARD ON THIS ISSUE. I APPRECIATE EVERYTHING SHE'S DOING ALONG WITH COUNCILLOR ESSAIBI-GEORGE.

I GUESS I HAVE A COUPLE OUESTIONS.

THE REVIEW BOARD THAT IS WITH THE PUBLIC SCHOOL, I HOPE THEY'RE US A RESIDENTS OF BOSTON, NUMBER 1.

THERE'S BEEN A DISCONNECT WITH EMPLOYMENT IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS BECAUSE TOO MANY OF THEM ARE NOT LIVING IN THE CITY BECAUSE THEY FOR WHATEVER REASON UNDER THAT STATUTE UNDER THE STATE, IS A TEACHER.

IN THE PAST I'VE HAD
CONVERSATIONS WITH
ADMINISTRATION FROM THE BPS.
THEY DIDN'T REALLY WANT TO LOOK
AT STUDENT RESIDENCY.
THEY JUST WANTED TO KEEP THE
NUMBERS UP FOR FEDERAL FUNDING
OR STATE FUNDING.

ALSO, I WANTED TO KNOW -- I CAME IN A LITTLE LATE, BUT I WANTED TO KNOW IF THERE'S LIKE SERIOUS INVESTIGATION FOR STUDENTS THAT ARE APPLYING OR HAS BEEN ACCEPTED INTO BPS WHO HAVE DOCUMENTATION FROM SCHOOLS OUTSIDE OF THE CITY.

YOU KNOW, IS THERE A LITTLE MORE DIGGING THAT GOES ON WITH THOSE STUDENTS.

THAT WAS ONE OF THE QUESTIONS. >> SO I CAN ANSWER THAT LAST OUESTION.

I DON'T KNOW IF THERE'S -- SO RIGHT NOW WE ARE -- WE HAVE THE INDIVIDUAL THAT OVERSEES ALL OF THE TESTING IN THE WELCOME CENTER.

SHE PUTS TOGETHER A LIST FOR THE RESIDENCY INVESTIGATOR OF ALL STUDENTS THAT HAVE TAKEN THE TEST, WHO GO TO SCHOOL OUT OF DISTRICT, WHETHER THAT BE PRIVATE, PAROCHIAL OR OTHER SCHOOLS.

AND SO WE GET THAT LIST IN ADVANCE OF EXAMS FOR NOTIFICATION.

SO THAT IS -- WE'RE SORT OF GETTING THAT LIST RIGHT NOW. WE ABSOLUTELY DO A MUCH DEEPER DIVE ON THOSE BECAUSE IT BECOMES MORE DIFFICULT ONCE WE INVITE. WE GIVE THE INVITATION.

IF WE CAN GET AHEAD OF THE GAME, WHICH WE'VE GOTTEN MUCH BETTER AT, AND INVESTIGATING BEFORE, WE WILL NOT INVITE THEM IN TO SCHOOL.

YES, WE DO DO THAT.

I DON'T KNOW IF THERE'S OTHER QUESTIONS.

>> MY OTHER QUESTION IS WHAT DEFINITION OF RESIDENCY IS THE BPS GOING BY?

BECAUSE UNDER THE CITY, IT'S WHERE YOU LAY YOUR HEAD AT LEAST FOUR NIGHTS OUT OF THE WEEK. WHERE YOU SLEEP, WHERE YOUR

CLOTHES ARE.
WHERE YOUR ARTIFACTS ARE.
AND THIS IS -- I THINK IN THE
CASE OF THE COUNCILLOR
ESSAIBI-GEORGE IS TALKING ABOUT,
WE'RE, YOU KNOW, WHERE THEIR
CENTRAL LIFE IS UNFORTUNATELY
THE CITY -- THE BPS PROBABLY
WASN'T PREPARED FOR A SNAZZY
LAWYER TO ARGUE THAT CASE.
BUT YOU KNOW, THAT DEFINITION
ALONE SHOULD STAY IN WHEN THEY
FILLED OUT THE APPLICATION AND
WHO HAS GOT IN.
SHOULD GO BY GUARDIANSHIP AND

WHERE THAT CHILD IS LYING THEIR HEAD DOWN AT THE END OF THE DAY. >> I CAN'T SPEAK TOO IN DEPTH ABOUT THAT.

I'VE HAD CONVERSATIONS WITH THE LEGAL COUNSEL ABOUT THAT DEFINITION.

IF I'M NOT MISTAKEN, IT'S PART OF SOME CASE LAW.

BUT I CAN'T SPEAK TOO FULLY ON THAT.

WE'VE HAD CONVERSATIONS ABOUT IT.

AND THERE IS -- THERE IS

PRECEDENT, WHETHER IT'S
PRECEDENT IN BOSTON OR
MASSACHUSETTS, I CAN'T ANSWER
BUT I KNOW THERE'S PRECEDENT.
>> IF YOU CAN DO ME A FAVOR.
DISTRICT YOUR QUESTION TO THE
CHAIR.

>> SO MY FINAL QUESTION IS -- I DIDN'T HEAR ANY TALK ABOUT THIS. I KNOW WE'RE PREDOMINANTLY TALKING ABOUT THE BPS. I'M JUST CURIOUS ABOUT THE

CHARTER SCHOOL.

I KNOW A LOT OF STUDENTS OUTSIDE

THE CITY ARE ATTENDING THE CHARTER SCHOOLS INSIDE THE CITY. SO, YOU KNOW, IS THERE ANY CONVERSATION ABOUT THAT?

I KNOW THIS IS FEDERAL FUNDING. I CAN SEE -- IN FUNDING, WHERE

I CAN SEE -- IN FUNDING, WHERE DOES THE MONEY COME.

I THINK THE CITY MONEY SPONSORS SCHOOLS, TOO, CORRECT?

>> WE COULD GET SOME -- SO ONE, THE CHARTERS -- THIS IS A LITTLE COMPLICATED.

THE DOLLARS FOLLOW THE STUDENT. AND THOSE SCHOOLS ARE ACTUALLY PHYSICALLY IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

I BELIEVE THAT CHARTERS ARE ACTUALLY ALLOWED TO -- AND THERE'S MANY CHARTERS IN BOSTON THAT ACTUALLY ARE ABLE TO FIELD STUDENTS FROM MULTIPLE MUNICIPALITIES.

I THINK ONE OF THE THINGS THAT YOU BROUGHT UP EARLIER IS CRITICAL.

WE HAVE IT IN MEDICAL RECORDS NOW, SOME TYPE OF UNIQUE IDENTIFIER.

SO THE EASIEST WAY TO FIGURE THIS STUFF OUT IS THAT IF THERE IS -- I DON'T KNOW THAT -- IF YOU CAN CLARIFY ON THE BPS SIDE. IS THERE A UNIQUE IDENTIFIER THAT SAYS I'M TITO JACKSON, BORN ON APRIL 11th AND THESE ARE --AND IS IT AT THE STATE LEVEL? THE INTERESTING PIECE WOULD BE IF WE HAD A UNIQUE IDENTIFIER, THIS WOULD ABSOLUTELY BE VERY EASY, WHICH WOULD STATE, OKAY, TITO IS APPLYING FOR BOSTON LATIN SCHOOL BUT CURRENTLY ASSIGNED AT BROOKLINE HIGH SCHOOL OR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL OR MIDDLE SCHOOL.

SO DO WE HAVE -- WHEN I TAKE A TEST FOR MCAS OR PARK, IS THERE SOMETHING ATTACHED TO MY NAME AS A UNIQUE IDENTIFIER AS WHO I AM? >> EVERY STUDENT HAS A STATE I.D. THAT WE USE.

>> SO I GUESS MY QUESTION,
ESPECIALLY FOR THE TEST SCHOOL
COMPONENT, IF THAT STUDENT -- I
DON'T KNOW WHAT TYPE OF
RECIPROCITY YOU HAVE WITH
ANOTHER TOWN, BUT OUT OF ALL OF
THE STUDENTS -- THIS IS PROBABLY
PRETTY EASY -- OUT OF ALL OF
THOSE STUDENTS THAT SIGN UP FOR
THE ISCE, CAN YOU BOUNCE THAT
LIST OFF OF THAT STATE LIST THAT
DETERMINES WHETHER -- THAT'S NOT
TOO HARD, RIGHT?

>> WE HAVE TO GET THEIR SCHOOL RECORDS ANYWAY.

>> WE ACTUALLY ARE ABLE TO IDENTIFY.

WHAT CAROLYN WAS TALKING ABOUT, THERE'S TWO PIECES.

THE FAMILY HAS TO COME IN -- IF THEY'RE GOING TO TAKE THE TEST TO BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS, PRIOR TO THAT, THEY HAVE TO VERIFY THEY'RE A BOSTON RESIDENCY. IF YOU'RE TAKING THE TEST WITH ERB, THEY'LL DO A PRIVATE TESTING SITE. THAT'S NOT REQUIRED.

BEFORE THEY CAN ACTUALLY BE EXTENDED AN OFFER, THEY WOULD HAVE -- THEY STILL HAVE TO COME DO THAT.

EVEN IF THEY GO TO ERB, THEY HAVE TO SIT FOR THE TEST AND BE VERIFIED RESIDENCY BY ANY FAMILY THAT IS COMING TO SIT FOR BPS. WE HAVE A DEADLINE FOR THAT. THE ADDITIONAL STEP THAT WE'VE BEEN TRYING TO TAKE, EVEN THOUGH THEY VERIFY RESIDENCY, IF THEY'RE NOT ATTENDING A SCHOOL IN THE BOSTON AREA, WE ARE STILL SHARING THAT INFORMATION WITH THIS REVIEW COMMITTEE SO THEY CAN DO AN ADDITIONAL CHECK, IF YOU WILL, JUST TO VERIFY WHAT THEY PRODUCE ON PAPER IS TRUE IN ACTUALITY.

>> OKAY.

>> I ONLY HAVE A COMMENT.

MY HEAD COLD --

>> YOU DIDN'T TELL ME ABOUT THAT.

>> I JUST WANT TO COMMENT I'M GLAD THIS HEARING IS TAKING PLACE AND I HOPE TO FURTHER WORK WITH THE BPS ON BOTH EMPLOYEE AND STUDENT SITUATIONS.

I THANK YOU FOR THE WORK THAT YOU'RE DOING.

>> I'M DENISE WILLIAMS HARRIS.
I'M ON THE RESIDENCE COMPLIANCE
COMMITTEE AND WITH SAVE OUR
CITY.

I HAVE ONE QUESTION. YOU BROUGHT UP THAT YOU DO

INVESTIGATING.

PART OF IT ALSO, WHEN YOU FIND A STUDENT OR THE FAMILY DOES NOT LIVE IN THE CITY, THEY -- THEN YOU'VE BEEN IN THE SCHOOL SYSTEM.

I ASSUME YOU HAVE A HEARING.
AM I NOT RIGHT?
YOU HAVE A HEARING?
>> MY UNDERSTANDING IS THERE A
TIMES THAT THERE ARE HEARINGS
AND OTHER TIMES THERE'S NOT.
>> SO AT THE END OF THE PROCESS
AND THE STUDENT, I GATHER, HAS
TO LEAVE THE PUBLIC SCHOOL,
BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM, IS

THERE A MONETARY AMOUNT THAT THE FAMILY HAS TO PAY?

>> YES.

DURING THE COURSE OF THE HEARING, WE DISCUSS INVOICING AND THE DOLLAR AMOUNTS, WHICH IS ABOUT \$86 A DAY.

>> SO THE FAMILY HAS TO PAY THAT AMOUNT.

>> YES.

THEY'RE BILLED.

WE GET THAT DATA.

>> OKAY.

SO IS THAT INFORMATION -- IS
THAT COMMUNICATED WITH, YOU
KNOW -- BECAUSE I'M -- I WOULD
LIKE TO KNOW ABOUT THAT.
IF THEY'RE DOING -INVESTIGATING PROCESS AND THE

RESIDENCY COMPLIANCE, YOU KNOW, OURSELVES ARE DOING INVESTIGATION, CAN'T WE WORK TOGETHER ON THIS?

THERE SEEMS LIKE THERE'S A LACK OF COMMUNICATION.

AND ALSO, THERE WAS SAID SOMETHING ABOUT THERE'S ONLY ONE INVESTIGATOR.

IS THIS INVESTIGATOR FULL TIME, PART TIME?

WHAT IS THE PROCESS?

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE HIM AND HER TO DO HIS OR HER -- HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?

THERE'S A LIMITED AMOUNT OF TIME THAT THEY DO THIS INVESTIGATION. ALSO, ARE THE FEEL THAT ARE ON THIS PROCESS OF THEIR RESIDENCY, ARE THEY LIKE MRS. BOYLE SAID, ARE THEY EMPLOYEES, PARENTS? WHO SELECTS THESE PEOPLE? THAT'S WHAT I'M SAYING.

>> AND I WOULD ALSO NOTE AND COUNCILLOR ESSAIBI-GEORGE BROUGHT IT UP EARLIER, WE'RE UNDERSTAFFED WHEN IT COMES TO

IF EXPONENTIALLY HIRE, IF YOU THINK ABOUT IT, ABOUT 17,000 CITY EMPLOYEES AND THERE ARE A COUPLE OF INVESTIGATORS, I BELIEVE.

ISN'T THAT -->> WE HAVE ONE. >> WE HAVE ONE.

THAT'S 1 TO 17,000 RATIO VERSUS A 1 TO 58,000 RATIO, WHICH I THINK IS -- IN ADDITION, AT THE CITY LEVEL, WE'RE LOOKING AT WHERE THAT ONE INDIVIDUAL LIVES, NOT WHERE THEIR PARENTS LIVE. SO IT MAKES IT -- YOU'RE GRAVELY UNDERRESOURCED WHEN IT COMES TO ACTUALLY DOING THIS WORK. DO YOU WANT TO RESPOND TO ANY OF THE QUESTIONS?

>> I MEAN, I THINK MOST OF THE QUESTIONS THAT WERE ASKED I THINK IS INFORMATION WE'RE WAITING FOR.

WE'LL BE HAPPY TO SHARE THAT WITH YOU ONCE I RECEIVE IT.

>> IN CLOSING REMARKS?

>> I THINK WE'RE VERY COMMITTED TO MAKING SURE THAT BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND BOSTON RESIDENTS AND IN THE PROCESS WE'RE ATTENDING TO THIS ISSUE AND NOT HARMING HISTORICALLY MARGINALIZED FAMILIES.

WE LOOK FORWARD TO BRINGING TO YOU IN THE SPRING THE OUTCOMES OF OUR PROCESSES AND THINKING ABOUT THE OPTIONS THAT WE LIKE TO PUT IN PLACE.

AND TO WORKING WITH THE BOSTON COMMUNITY AS WE IMPLEMENT THEM.

>> CAROLINE?

CLOSING REMARKS?

>> WE TAKE THIS VERY, VERY SERIOUSLY.

BOTH EMPLOYEE AND STUDENT RESIDENCY.

I THINK WHAT MONICA SAID, LOOKING AT HOW WE CAN TIGHTEN THE PROCESS WITHOUT DOING IRREPARABLE HARM TO FAMILIES, I CERTAINLY LOOK FORWARD TO THOSE CONVERSATIONS.

>> VERY GOOD.

AND I ALSO NOTE -- I WANT TO END ON WHAT MONICA ENDED ON.
THIS ALSO HAS TO BE LOOKED THROUGH AN EQUITY LIST.

IT IS THE RULES AND PROCESS OF THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE TO LOOK AT EVERYTHING FOR THE OPPORTUNITY AND ACHIEVEMENT GAP. MANY OF THE FOLKS THAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT, THESE ARE MARGINALIZED POPULATIONS. JUST SIMPLY TRYING TO DO THE BEST THAT THEY CAN TO HOLD ON. AND I THINK WE NEED TO BE CONNECTING THE NEED WITH THE RESOURCES THAT ARE OUT THERE. IF THE RESOURCES DON'T EXIST, IT'S INCUMBENT ON THE BOSTON CITY COUNCIL, MAYOR'S OFFICE AND THE BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO PROVIDE THE RESOURCES IN ORDER TO HAVE THE OUTCOMES THAT WE NEED.
