**AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND** Efficiency and Regionalization Grant FUNDS, AWARDED BY MA Department of Revenue.

**WHEREAS**, the MA Department of Revenue, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Office of Economic Development; and

**WHEREAS**, the funds in the amount of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (**\$100,000.00**) would fund the Greater Boston Regional Economic Compact Cities to hire a consultant who will develop an Action Plan of operational projects based on overlapping needs expressed in the municipalities' community master plans.
