WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Fire Department; and

WHEREAS, the funds in the amount of NINE HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE DOLLARS (\$966,871.00) would fund an Accountability Management System for critical onscene activities, including Personal Accountability Reports and unit assignments. Therefore be it

ORDERED: that the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City of Boston be, and hereby is authorized, pursuant to section 53A of chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, to accept and expend the Federal Emergency Management Agency, FFY2017 Assistance to Firefighters Grant award not to exceed the amount of NINE HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY-ONE DOLLARS (\$966,871.00).
