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>>> GOOD AFTERNOON, AND WELCOME TO THE CHRISTOPHER IANELO CHAMBER BER.

MY NAME IS MATT O'MALLEY, I'M THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENT SUSTAINABILITY AND PARKS. AND WE ARE HERE TODAY TO DISCUSS DOCKET NUMBER 1375.

THIS IS AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXTEND A PARKLAND ACQUISITIONS AND RENOVATIONS YOUR COMMUNITY, OR PARK PROGRAM GRANTS FROM THE MASSACHUSETTS EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS, DIVISION OF CONSERVATION, FOR \$400,000, TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT. WE ARE JOINED BY ALDON GRANTNER, AND IT IS TO FUND FACE TWO OF THE RENOVATION OF THE PARK IN DORCHESTER.

THE AIR AND BEE PARK IS LOCATED IN DORCHESTER, AND IT WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1892.

WE ARE JOINED BY MY DEAR COLLEAGUE AND FRIEND, THE AT-LARGE COUNCILLOR FROM DORCHESTER, WHO IS MUCH BETTER COUNSELLOR THAN A FIXER OF SIGNS, WELCOME, COUNSELLOR.

THIS IS 45 ACRES OF THE RECREATION OF USE, AND IT INCLUDES BASKETBALL COURTS, MULTI-PURPOSE FIELDS, LITTLE LEAGUE FIELD AND PLAY SPACES. IT IS A MULTI-PHASE PARK RENOVATION THAT INCLUDES A NEW PLAYGROUND ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE PARK, AS WELL

AS LIGHTING IMPROVEMENTS.
BEFORE I TURN IT OVER TO
MR. GARRETT, THERE ARE A
COUPLE OF HOUSEKEEPING
ITEMS: ONE, THIS IS A
PUBLIC HEARING, SO ANYONE
WHO WOULD LIKE TO TESTIFY,
THEY ARE MORE THAN WELCOME
TO DO SO.

JUST SIGN UP ON THE SHEET
TO MY LEFT AT THE BACK OF
THE ROOM.

THIS IS CURRENTLY BEING
BROADCAST LIVE, AS WELL AS
STREAMED ON CABLE, AND I
WOULD JUST ASK ALL OF THE
AUDIENCE TO PLEASE SILENCE
THEIR CELL PHONES BECAUSE
IT CAN BE A LITTLE
DISTRACTION, ALTHOUGH THE
CROWD IS NOT TOO BAG.
COUNCILLOR, DO YOU HAVE
ANY OPENING COMMENTS?

>> I DON'T.

THIS IS SOMETHING I THINK
WE ARE ALL VERY EXCITED TO
HEAR.

MR. GARRETT, DO YOU HAVE
ANY OPENING REPARKS?
REMARKS?>> YES.

I WANTED TO SHOW YOU THE
MAP OF THE CITY, SO YOU
GET SOME CONTACTS.

IT WAS FORMERLY KNOWN AS
FRANKLIN FIELD, AND IT WAS
LOCATED SPECIFICALLY RIGHT
HERE.

BACK IN THE MIDDLE OF THE
'80s, IT WAS RENAMED.

WE'RE APPLYING FOR
\$400,000 FROM THE STATE'S
PARKS GRANT PROGRAM TO
HELP US IN PHASE TWO OF
THE REDEVELOPMENT OF
HOROMBI PARK.

AT 45 ACRES, IT IS A HUGE
PARK COMPARISON TO MOST OF
THE PARKS IN THE CITY.

AND THEY'RE GOING TO TRY
TO DO IT ALL AT ONCE --
HE'S BROKEN IT DOWN INTO
PHASES.

AND THERE ARE FIVE PHASES.
THE FIRST PHASE HAS JUST

BEEN COMPLETED THIS YEAR.
A NEW PLAYGROUND AND
BASKETBALL COURTS IN THIS
AREA.

AND THE START OF WHAT IS,
YOU KNOW, A MAJOR NEW
FEATURE OF THIS
RECONSTRUCTION.

THIS MASTER PLAN WE
CREATED IS PRIMARILY
FOCUSED ON CREATING A
MUCH-IMPROVED CIRCULATION
SYSTEM FOR THE PARK.

RIGHT NOW, EXCEPT FOR SOME
PATHWAYS ON THE EDGES,
IT'S JUST SEEN AS ONE BIG,
GREEN SPACE, AS ORIGINALLY
PLANTED.

THEY WANTED TO CREATE A
SPACE FOR ATHLETIC FIELDS
THAT COULD NOT BEEN
ACCOMMODATED IN THE
EMERALD NECKLACE.

SO THIS PARK WAS CREATED.
AND THERE ARE FIELDS FOR
ALL SORTS OF ORGANIZED
LEAGUES.

THE AVERAGE CITY, THOUGH,
IF THEY'RE NOT ENGAGED IN
ORGANIZED PLAY, TYPICALLY
LOOK AT THIS VAST EXPANSE
AND THINK THEY CAN'T USE
THIS.

SO WE'RE CREATING THIS
PATHWAY SYSTEM SO THAT IT
WILL INCREASE USE AND
IMPROVE THE CHANCES FOR
PEOPLE IN THIS SECTION OF
THE CITY TO HAVE EXERCISE,
WALKING, RUNNING, ETC.,
AND WE'RE ALSO DOING A LOT
MORE THAN JUST THIS.

WE'RE -- AND THIS IS, AS
WE SAID -- WE'VE ADDED A
WHOLE NEW PLAY AREA IN THE
FIRST PHASE, AND IN THE
SECOND PHASE, GRANTING A
PERFORMANCE SPACE, AND
WITH THE NEW PATHWAYS AND
NEW ENTRANCE, THAT WILL
PROVIDE PASSES, BENCHES,
PLACES FOR PEOPLE TO
ENGAGE WITH EACH OTHER.
WE'RE TAKING TWO ATHLETIC

FIELDS THAT ARE ORIENTED EAST, WEST, WHICH IS A BAD ORIENTATION FOR ATHLETICS. WHEN THE SUN SETS YOU DON'T WANT TO BE FACING IN THE DIRECTION OF THE SUN. SO WE'RE DOING A NEW SOUTH ORIENTATION.

>> JUST FOR OUR EDUCATION, EDIFICATION, WHAT IS THE CROSS STREET.

>> THIS IS CALVIN, AND THIS IS THE COMMUNITY CENTER RIGHT HERE.

>> THANK YOU.

>> THE OTHER THING IS WE'RE TRYING TO IMPROVE DRAINAGE FOR THE FIELD SO THEY CAN BE -- THESE ARE GOING TO BE NATURAL TURF FIELDS, NOT ARTIFICIAL TURF.

AND THEY'RE GOING TO BE -- THE DRAINAGE IS GOING TO BE IMPROVED SO THEY CAN BE -- AFTER STORM EVENTS, THEY'LL DRY AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE AND GET AS DRY AS POSSIBLE.

PART OF THE REASON THEY GET SO WET OUT HERE IS BECAUSE OUR STORM DRAIN SYSTEM ACTUALLY HAS AN OUTLET INTO THE PARK.

THIS WAS AGREED TO MANY DECADES AGO.

AND NOW WE'RE GOING TO CREATE A MUCH MORE DEFINED DRAINAGE AREA HERE THAT WILL SEGREGATE THESE PEAK FLOWS IN THIS PARTICULAR AREA.

AND WHAT THIS GRANT WILL SPECIFICALLY DO IS HELP US WITH CREATING PLANTINGS THAT WILL BE MUCH RICHER ECOLOGICALLY, AND ALSO IT WILL BE, YOU KNOW, CERTAINLY ONE AREA THAT THE CANADA GEESE WOULDN'T BE FREQUENTING. THEY DON'T LIKE RELATIVELY TALL VEGETATION. WE'LL ALSO BE ADDING A LOT

MORE TREES.

MOST PEOPLE WHEN THEY GO
OUT THERE, THEY WANT TO
SEE IF THEY CAN EXPANSE
THE BALL FIELDS.

OBVIOUSLY, IN THE HEAT OF
JULY, THEY WILL BE ADDING
MORE TREES.

THAT WILL HELP WITH THE
CAPTURE OF CARBON AND
WE'LL DO OUR PART TO
IMPROVE CONDITIONS
VIS-A-VIS CLIMATE CHANGE.

AS I MENTIONED, WE'LL BE
CREATING THIS PERFORMANCE
BASE, AND WE'LL BE FITTING
INTO THIS ALREADY-EXISTING
HILLSIDE, AND WE'LL BE
ALSO BE PROGRAMMING THAT.
AND WE'LL OFTEN HAVE
CONCERTS THERE AND SUCH
THAT DON'T CURRENTLY
EXIST.

AND, YEAH, THAT'S IT.
ANY OTHER QUESTIONS?

>> THAT'S GREAT.

I THINK WE WILL.

IF YOU WOULDN'T MIND
EITHER SITTING OR GETTING
CLOSER TO THE MIKE BECAUSE
WE NEED TO MAKE SURE THE
FOLKS WATCHING CAN HEAR.
I HAVE A COUPLE OF BRIEF
QUESTIONS.

I'VE BEEN JOINED BY THE
CITY COUNCILLOR FROM SOUTH
BOSTON, MICHAEL FLAHERTY.

I'M GOING TO GET INTO A
COUPLE OF QUICK QUESTIONS
AND GIVE IT TO MY
COLLEAGUES.

THIS IS PHASE TWO.

IS THIS THE FINAL PHASE?

>> NO.

THERE ARE FIVE PHASES.

>> SO THE TOTAL COST OF
PHASE TWO IS \$3.3 MILLION,
AND THE CITY IS DOING
2.9 MILLION, AND THE REST
WILL COME FROM THIS GRANT?

>> YES.

>> WHAT IS THE COST OF THE
NEXT FEW PHASES?

>> THAT I DON'T KNOW.

I CAN FIND OUT.

>> WE CAN ASSUME THAT EVERY PHASE WILL BE ABOUT \$3 MILLION, THAT IS --

>> I WOULD SAY THAT KIND OF RANGE, BETWEEN A MILLION AND A HALF TO \$3 MILLION PER PHASE IS PROBABLY LIKELY.

>> THAT'S GREAT.

THAT'S GREAT.

THIS IS SPECIFICALLY FOR, AS YOU MENTIONED, THE PLAYGROUND --

>> NO -- THE PLAYGROUND WAS THE FIRST PHASE.

>> AND THESE ARE FOR THE FIELDS?

>> YES.

>> AND THE PATHWAY?

>> THE PATHWAY THAT GOES ALL THE WAY TO THE EASTERN END OF THE PARK.

>> IN TERMS OF THE LIGHT FIXTURES, I ASSUME THEY'RE ENERGY-EFFICIENT --

>> OH, YEAH.

OH, DEFINITELY.

WE'VE JUST COMPLETED, I BELIEVE -- WELL, MAYBE WIRE IN THE FINAL PHASE OF OUR GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE STUDY.

AND CERTAINLY THAT IS AN ELEMENT THAT WE TRY TO EMPHASIZE WITH ALL OF OUR PROJECTS, IMPLEMENTING THAT.

>> AND THERE IS DRAINAGE -- JUST THE FACT THAT YOU'RE PLANTING MORE TREES, THAT WILL HELP WITH OUR TREE CANOPY AND THE FLOOD MITIGATION.

EVERY ENVIRONMENTALIST HAS TO BE A PARKS ADVOCATE AS WELL.

THIS IS EXCITING.

ARE THERE ANY WATER FEATURES IN THIS?

IF NOT PHASE TWO, MAYBE IN PHASE ONE, THE PLAYGROUND WATER FILLING STATIONS?

>> YES, I BELIEVE THERE

WERE IN THE FIRST PHASE.
THIS PHASE, I'M NOT SURE,
BUT I HAVE A FEELING THERE
WILL BE, ESPECIALLY
BECAUSE WE TEND TO TRY TO
DO THAT NEAR FIELD.

>> EXACTLY.

I KNOW CHIEF COOKE HAS
BEEN COMMITTED TO THAT.
IT GETS THOSE PLASTIC
BOTTLES OUT OF THE LITTER
STREAM AND ALSO PROVIDES A
SERVICE FOR RESIDENTS.
WE HAVE THE BEST-TASTING
TAP WATER IN THE COUNTRY.
MIGHT AS WELL ALLOW PEOPLE
TO USE IT.

I BELIEVE YOU HAD A
MEETING A COUPLE OF WEEKS
AGO?

>> YES.

>> AND SO THAT WILL
OBVIOUSLY CONTINUE WITH
THE PHASES?

>> YEAH.

I THINK THERE IS PROBABLY
JUST ONE MORE.

AND THIS, THAT I'M SHOWING
YOU HERE, PRESENTS THE
BASIC DETAILS.

AS YOU CAN SEE, THIS IS
LIKE ONE OPTION.

THERE IS ACTUALLY ANOTHER
OPTION.

BUT I WAS TOLD BY THE
PROJECT MANAGER, THIS IS
THE MOST LIKELY OF THE
OPTIONS BEING PRESENTED
THAT WILL GET IMPLEMENTED.

WHAT GETS -- THE
DIFFERENCES TEND TO BE
FAIRLY SMALL TWEAKS
BETWEEN THE DIFFERENT
DESIGN ALTERNATIVES.

>> AND I DON'T KNOW, YOU
MIGHT HAVE SAID THIS, I
APOLOGIZE IF I MISSED IT,
THIS IS GOING TO BE TURF
FIELDS?

>> NATURAL TURF.

>> AND THIS IS SORT OF THE
NEXT STEPS AND PHASES --
AND THE FEEDBACK HAS BEEN
OVERWHELMINGLY ACCEPTABLE.

>> OH, YES.

>> DO YOU HAVE ANY
QUESTIONS?

>> YES.

WOULD YOU DETAIL FOR US
WHICH PHASES ARE WHICH AND
WHAT THE TIMELINE IS FOR
ALL OF THEM?

>> SURE.

I CAN'T REALLY GIVE YOU A
TIMELINE, BUT I CAN TELL
YOU GENERALLY WHAT THE
PHASES ARE.

THE FIRST PHASE WAS THIS
SECTION RIGHT HERE.

>> AND THAT'S DONE?

>> THAT'S DONE.

WE BROKE GROUND.

AND THERE IS THE
BASKETBALL COURTS.
AND THEN THIS IS THE
SECOND PHASE HERE.

ALSO WITH THE COMPLETION
OF THIS CROSS -- THIS
MAJOR EAST-WEST PEDESTRIAN
PATH.

I'M GOING TO TRY THE BEST
I CAN TO REMEMBER THERE'S,
I THINK, A PHASE THREE
HERE.

AND THEN LIKE A PHASE FOUR
IN THESE TWO AREAS, AND
THEN PHASE FIVE HERE.

I CAN SEND YOU THE PHASING
DIAGRAM THAT WE HAVE.

>> THAT WOULD BE GREAT.

>> THE TIMELINE, I'M NOT
SURE.

I HAVE A FEELING WHAT --
THAT BASICALLY WE'RE GOING
TO INITIATE DESIGN FOR THE
NEXT PHASE IN THE -- YOU
KNOW, PROBABLY, I WOULD
GUESS, EVERY TWO YEARS.
BECAUSE YOU WANT TO HAVE
THE PROJECT MANAGER
REFOCUSED ON THE DESIGN
AND CONSTRUCTION DURING
THAT EVERY TWO-YEAR
PERIOD, BECAUSE USUALLY
THE DESIGN TAKES ABOUT A
YEAR, AND THE CONSTRUCTION
IN THE NEXT PHASE.

>> THANK YOU.

I APPRECIATE THAT PHASING
DIAGRAM.

AND THEN WITH THE NATURAL
GRASS TURF, WHICH I'M A
HUGE BELIEVER IN, AND I
THINK THE ABILITY TO
UTILIZE ARTIFICIAL TURF IS
GREAT, BECAUSE WE CAN USE
IT SORT OF LONGER TERM AND
THROUGH DIFFERENT WEATHER.
I FEAR THAT OVER TIME, OUR
KIDS WON'T HAVE THE
EXPERIENCE OF EVER PLAYING
ON REAL GRASS AS WE MOVE
TOWARDS ARTIFICIAL TURF
ACROSS MOST PARKS
EVERYWHERE.

WHAT ABOUT IRRIGATION,
THOUGH, AND MAINTENANCE?

>> JUST OF THE PHASE TWO

STRENGTHEN THE GRASS.

YEAH.

AND BECAUSE IN THOSE
REALLY DRY PERIODS, YOU,
YOU KNOW -- NOT HAVING
THAT -- NOT HAVING GRASS
BEING WATERED WEAKENS THE
GRASS, AND THEREFORE, WITH
POST-RAIN EVENTS, THEY'RE
GOING TO JUST BE A MUCH
POORER CONDITION ONCE
THEY'RE PLAYED ON AGAIN.
YEAH, WE WANT TO HAVE
IRRIGATION, FOR SURE.

THAT'S A LOT OF WHAT THE
COST IS.

>> THIS PARK HERE HAS AN
ESPECIALLY LARGE
POPULATION OF THE CANADA
GEESE --

>> YES.

>> -- THAT ARE THERE, AND
THEY DESTROY THE GRASS.

>> YES.

>> SO ARE THERE ANY PLANS INCORPORATED IN ANY OF THIS PROCESS TO MITIGATE THE GEESE USE OF THAT PARK?

BECAUSE WE'RE INVESTING A LOT OF MONEY, OBVIOUSLY, ESPECIALLY INTO THE NATURAL GRASS TURF --

>> YEAH.

>> -- AND THEN WE'RE GOING TO HAVE, ON ANY GIVEN DAY THAT YOU DRIVE BY, THERE ARE SEVERAL HUNDRED, IF NOT A THOUSAND, GEESE OUT THERE.

>> RIGHT.

>> IT IS PRETTY STUNNING TO SEE IT.

AND ALL THEY'RE DOING IS EATING AND PRODUCING WASTE ON THAT PARK.

>> OH, YEAH.

I DON'T HAVE AN ANSWER FOR YOU, BUT I WILL ASK INTERNALLY TO FIND OUT. YOU KNOW, I KNOW IN CERTAIN SECTIONS, WE'VE USED EITHER A COATING OR THE BORDER COLLIES HAVE CHASED THEM AWAY.

>> WITH SUCH A SIGNIFICANT INVESTIGATION, WE SHOULD BE DOING THIS, BUT ALSO KNOWING THE WEAR AND TEAR THAT THE GEESE PUT ON THIS INVESTMENT.

I THINK IT IS IMPORTANT TO TAKE NOTE OF IT, ESPECIALLY A PARK OF THIS SIZE.

THERE MAY BE A THOUSAND -- I KID YOU NOT, AND THEY THINK I'M CRAZY.

>> NO.

WE, IN OUR POWER-POINT PRESENTATION THAT THE CONSULTANTS DO, THEY'LL SHOW PICTURES AND THERE ARE HUGE FLOCKS. IT IS AMAZING.

>> AND WE'RE TALKING ABOUT MILLIONS OF DOLLARS HERE

THAT WE'RE INVESTING.

THANK YOU.

>> WHAT IS GOOD FOR THE
GOOSE IS GOOD FOR THE
GANDER?

>> SIMILAR TO THAT.

>> COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY.

>> YES.

>> DO YOU KNOW HOW MANY
TREES WILL BE PLANTED IN
EITHER OF THE PHASES,
PHASE ONE, TWO, THREE,
FOUR, OR FIVE?

>> I'M TRYING TO REMEMBER
THE NUMBER THAT WAS QUOTED
TO ME THIS MORNING.

IT WAS, UM...I THINK -- I
THINK IT IS 27.

BUT THERE MAY BE MORE.

AGAIN, I WILL DEFINITELY
GET THAT.

>> IF YOU CAN GET THAT TO
THE CHAIR.

>>> AND LOOKING AT THE MAPIN FRONT OF YOU, WHERE
WOULD THE FOOTBALL FIELD
BE AND WHERE WOULD THE
BASEBALL FIELDS BE?

>> IN THE FINAL DESIGN, I
THINK THE FOOTBALL FIELD
WOULD BE HERE.

AND I THINK BASEBALL
FIELDS WILL BE HERE.

RIGHT NOW WE HAVE -- THIS
IS AN OLDER DRAWING.

NOW THEY'RE UP HERE.

AND THE BASEBALL WILL BE
IN HIS AREA HERE.

>> GOTCHA.

AND OBVIOUSLY A BIG PIECE
OF THE PARK

REVITALIZATION, THOSE
PHASES, WE WANT PEOPLE TO
COME AND ENJOY IT, AND WE
WANT THE LOCAL SPORTS
TEAMS TO BE ABLE TO
COMPETE THERE.

>> YES.

>> AND TEAMS FROM THE
NEIGHBORING NEIGHBORHOODS
AND EVEN BEYOND THAT.

I KNOW THAT BETWEEN
TALBOTT AND BLUE HILL, AND
EVEN CUTTING THROUGH THE
PROJECTS, THERE IS STREET

PARKING.

IS THERE ANY OPPORTUNITIES
FOR SOME TYPE OF PARKING
LOT?

THAT IS ONE OF THE BIG
COMPLAINTS YOU GET WHEN
THERE IS A TOURNAMENT OR A
GAME.

I LOOK AT THAT AREA, AND
YOU'VE GOT A WEEKEND
SERVICE AT THE GREATER
TABERNACLE CHURCH, AND YOU
HAVE AN EVENT HAPPENING AT
THE CLUB, THE WHITE
BUILDING THERE, AND A
COUPLE OF OTHER THINGS
HAPPENING, AND THERE IS A
JAMBOREE OR SOME OTHER
TYPE OF EVENT, SOCCER
TOURNAMENT, THERE IS JUST
NOWHERE FOR THOSE FOLKS TO
PARK.

AND THOSE CARS WILL BE
GOING INTO THE
NEIGHBORHOOD.

I DON'T KNOW WHETHER OR
NOT THERE IS ANY TYPE OF
PARKING PLAN OR SURFACE
LOT OPPORTUNITY ON THE
CORNER OF BLUE HILL AND
CALVIN -- YOU HAVE
SOMETHING ON THAT UPPER
CORNER --

>> YOU PARK IN THE AREA.

>> AND THAT'S ABOUT IT.

SO I DON'T KNOW WHETHER OR
NOT THERE IS ANY OTHER
OPPORTUNITY TO EITHER
EXPAND THAT OR PROVIDE
SOME OTHER TYPE OF SURFACE
PARKING SOMEWHERE AROUND
HORONBI.

IT IS FOR VISITING TEAMS
AND FOR TOURNAMENTS.
THERE IS THE POP WARNER
TEAM, AND THE LACROSSE
TEAMS, AND WE WANT THEM TO
BE ABLE TO PROUDLY HOST
OTHER COMMUNITIES AND
OTHER TEAMS.

AND SOMETIMES PARKING
ISN'T GOOD FOR THAT.

>> SURE.

I'LL CULT THE PROJECT

MANAGER AND GET BACK WITH YOU ON THAT.

>> GREAT.

THANK YOU.

>> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR FLAHERTY AND GEORGE.

I HAVE NO MORE FURTHER QUESTIONS.

OBVIOUSLY, I'LL BE URGING MY COLLEAGUES TO ACCEPT AND EXTEND THIS GRANT AT OUR FINAL COUNCIL HEARING OF THE YEAR, WHICH WILL BE TWO DAYS FROM NOW.

ANY TIME IT'S A LARGER AMOUNT OF MONEY, I STILL THINK IT IS WORTHWHILE TO HAVE A HEARING, AS WE'RE DOING RIGHT NOW.

I APPRECIATE YOUR TIME, MR. DARREN, AND THE GOOD QUESTIONS OF BOTH OF MY COLLEAGUES.

THEY FEEL VERY, VERY STRONGLY ABOUT, MAKING SURE WE'RE ABLE TO ALLOCATE FUNDS AND RESOURCES FOR OUR OPEN SPACE.
