ORDER FOR A HEARING REGARDING THE USE OF PUBLIC WAYS

WHEREAS, The City of Boston proudly hosts dozens of charity walks, road races, and parades throughout the year; and

WHEREAS, Just last month the entire City of Boston was thrilled to host yet another "Duck Boat Parade" in honor of our World Champion Boston Red Sox; and

WHEREAS, Certain road races and fundraising walks such as the Boston Marathon and the Walk for Hunger are great Boston traditions that we all celebrate; and

WHEREAS, The Back Bay, Beacon Hill, and Fenway neighborhoods are primarily residential areas; and

WHEREAS, The Back Bay community has been subjected to dramatically higher parking meter fees than any other neighborhood in the City of Boston as part of the Performance Parking Program; and

WHEREAS, Every year new road races requiring street closures are permitted, primarily in the Back Bay neighborhood; and

WHEREAS. These near weekly street closures impose an undue burden on local residents, in many instances making it impossible for people to access their own homes during these events; THEREFORE BE IT

ORDERED, That the appropriate committee of the Boston City Council hold a hearing to discuss the process for approving road closures for new road races and the like in our residential neighborhoods, and that representatives from the Boston Transportation Department, the Boston Police Department, the Mayor's Office of Tourism, Sports, and Entertainment, and other interested parties be invited to testify.
