THE TURNOUT FOR THE CITY OF BOSTON IS USUALLY AT ITS LOWEST. JUST TO GIVER YOU SUM NUMBERS, JUST IN MY DISTRICT ALONE IN 2017, WHEN THERE WAS A MAYORAL RACE THERE WAS A 26% TURNOUT. IN 2015 THERE WAS A COMPETITIVE WORK TON GROUND, 17% TURNOUT. IN 2013 WHEN THERE WAS A MAYORAL RACE AND A COMPETITIVE RACE, IT WAS 34% TURNOUT.

IN 2011 IT WAS 15%.

FOR MANY DISTRICTS IT IS LESS

THEY USED A MOBILE APPLICATION THAT IS -- SEEMS TO BE VERY SECURE AND CONFIDENTIAL. AND AN OFFICIAL WAY. AND FOR FOLKS TO CAST THEIR VOTE, FOR THOSE IN THE MILITARY. THEY USE IT FOR FIRST TIME, AND FEDERAL ELECTION, AND THERE'S A REPORT COMING FORWARD TO EXPLAIN HOW THAT WORKED AND HOW SECURE A PROCESS THAT IS. SO THOSE ARE SOME OF THE THINGS THAT WE'RE LOOKING AT IN TERMS OF SOME OF THE THINGS WE'RE ACTUALLY DOING. MILITARY VOTERS. >> RIGHT NOW AS MILITARY VOTERS REQUEST BALLOTS BE MAILED TO THEM, WE WILL SEND OUT A BLAST E-MAIL TO ALL THOSE FOLKS THAT HAVE SUPPLIED E-MAIL ADDRESSES, IF THEY THINK THEIR BALLOT IS NOT GOING TO GET BACK TO US IN THE RIGHT AMOUNT OF TIME. FRUSTRATING NO TRY TO GET MY BALLOT MAILED TO ME, ESPECIALLY SINCE WE'RE OFTEN MOVING AND NOT AT ONE LOCATION AT THE SAME TIME

SO JUST WHATEVER WE CAN DO TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR DEPLOYED VETERANS TO VOTE WOULD BE VERY IMPORTANT.

I KNOW YOU ARE MAKING PROGRESS AND I JUST WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT.

THE OTHER ISSUE THAT IS IMPORTANT TO ME IS MAKING SURE THAT THOSE IN THE DISABILITY COMMUNITY HAVE EQUAL ACCESS TO VOTING AS WELL.

WE'RE GOING TO MAKE SURE WE'RE **IDENTIFYING OTHER OPPORTUNITIES** TO CONTINUE TO MAKE VOTING CONVENIENT AND ACCESSIBLE FOR ALL OF OUR VOTE HOLDERS. >> THE OTHER ISSUE THAT IS IMPORTANT TO ME IS MAKING SURE THAT THE ABSENTEE BALLOT PROCESS IS IN LANGUAGES OTHER THAN ENGLISH, IF REQUESTED, WHAT IS THE LATEST ON THAT? ANY UPDATES ON HOW WE CAN MAKE THAT PROCESS EASIER FOR THOSE IN OUR IMMIGRANT COMMUNITY? >> YES, WE SHARE YOUR CONCERN. IN HAVING ABSENTEE BALLOTS, PARTICULARLY FOR REGULAR

ELECTIONS WE HAVE BALLOTS AVAILABILITY IN ENGLISH, SPANISH, CHINESE AND VIETNAMESE. THAT IS ONLY FOR ELECTION DAY. FOR ABSENTEE EARLY VOTING THOSE LANGUAGES AREN'T AVAILABLE. AS IT RELATES TO ABSENTEES. WE ARE CONCERNED THAT SOMEONE WHO IS VOTING NOT AT A POLLING PLACE WHERE WE HAVE FOLKS THAT ARE THERE TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE, THE MORE THAT THEY CAN ACT INDEPENDENTLY, THE BETTER. SO HAVING LANGUAGE, OTHER LANGUAGES AVAILABLE. WE THINK IS VERY IMPORTANT AND THAT'S A PRIORITY FOR US FOR THIS YEAR. WE INTEND TO DO WHAT WE CAN TO MAKE SURE THE MUNICIPAL BALLOT IS ACCESSIBLE AND AT LEAST THOSE LANGUAGES THAT I JUST MENTIONED, AND WE'RE TALKING TO THE STATE TO SEE IF THEY COULD CONSIDER GOING FORWARD TO MAKING SURE THAT'S ALSO THE SAME DURING STATE RUN ELECTIONS. >> IS THERE ANOTHER LANGUAGE THAT WE ARE NOT INCLUDED AS PART OF THAT ENGLISH-CHINESE, VIETNAMESE, SPANISH, IS THERE ANOTHER LANGUAGE THAT COULD BE INCLUDED IN THAT? >> WELL, I'M SURE THERE ARE MANY OTHER LANGUAGES THAT COULD BE INCLUDED BUT THE ONES WE'RE REQUIRED TO DO MANY ENGLISH, SPANISH, BASED ON DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FEDERAL GUIDELINES AND WE ALSO ESTABLISHED LOCAL STATE **GUIDELINES THAT REQUIRES CHINESE** AND VIETNAMESE BALLOTS. JUST PURELY FINANCIAL-WISE.
THANK YOU.

>> AND RAISE A POINT, ANY CONCERNS FROM THE DEPARTMENT IN TERMS OF GOING TO RUN CITYWIDE IN A SPECIAL, 255 WARDS, IN A VERY CONDENSED PERIOD OF TIME, THAT WOULD TELL ME, SOMEONE WITH POLITICAL RECOGNITION OR FROM A POLITICAL FAMILY, PROBABLY WOULD HAVE A SIGNIFICANT LEG UP ON ANY POTENTIAL OPPONENTS, BECAUSE IT'S CONDENSED LESBIAN FRAME AND RUNNING AGAINST THE CITY. I DON'T KNOW IF THE ELECTION DEPARTMENT HAS ANY THOUGHTS OR SHE HAS ANY IDEAS ON THAT BUT WHAT WOULD COME TO MIND? YOU WOULD PROBABLY FET A LOT OF INTEREST BUT IT WOULD MOST LIKELY THE WIN ARE WOULD BE SOMEONE THAT HAS SPHANT NAME RECOGNITION OR HAS HELD OFFICE BEFORE.

THAT IS MY THOUGHT, WHETHER OR NOT THAT IS THE INTENT DOESN'T

WHEN MANY OF US SUPPORT HAVING A

SO I GUESS FROM YOUR PE PERSPECTIVE, COMMISSIONER, REGISTRAR, DOCKET 311 REALLY WOULDN'T AFFECT YOU OTHER THAN IT MIGHT MAKE YOUR JOB A LITTLE BIT EASIER THAT THERE WOULD BE ENSURE ELECTIONS. HOPEFULLY, AND THEN I -- THAT MIGHT BALANCE IT OUT. 312, WOULD ALSO NOT BE DETRIMENTAL IF IT WERE TO BECAUSE BECAUSE IT AGAIN THIS ISN'T AN ISSUE THAT IS THAT PREVALENT BUT IT'S PREVALENT ENOUGH THAT IT WOULD MAKE IT EASIER ON YOUR COLLEAGUES IN THE ELECTIONS DEPARTMENT AND THEN 313 OBVIOUSLY WOULD PROBABLY BE THE MOST IMPACTFUL OF ALL, BECAUSE IT WOULD IT NECESSITATE A SPECIAL ELECTION. I THINK SABINA WOULD CORRECT ME IF I'M WRONG, A FIFTH POSITION WHERE A COUNCILOR HAS ASCENDED TO THE COUNCIL. SINCE 1983, THE FIFTH TIME. SO I GUESS THAT IS LESS THE QUESTIONS FROM ME BUT SORT OF MY THOUGHTS. >> COUNCILLOR ZAKIM. >> THANK YOU, MR. CHAIRMAN, I WANT TO THANK THE GENTLEMEN AND THE ELECTIONS DEPARTMENT FOR EVERYTHING YOU HAVE DONE FROM IMPLEMENTING EARLY VOTING AND TO EXPANDING ACCESS. I WAS PLEASED ABOUT THE OUTCOME OF OUR HEARING ABOUT THE BILL FOR EARLY VOTING, I LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH OUR COLLEAGUES ON GETTING THAT DONE UP AT THE STATE HOUSE SO THAT WE CAN HAVE IT IN PLACE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. I APPRECIATE THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT'S BRINGING THESE MATTERS FORWARD, AND HER EFFORTS TO I THINK MODERNIZE AND IMPROVE HOW THIS BODY OPERATES AND HOW WE INTERACT WITH OTHER CITY AGENCIES AND THE PUBLIC. I THINK AS WE GO THROUGH THE DIFFERENT DOCKETS AND I PREVENT

HOW COUNCILOR O'MALLEY WENT ONE

BY ONE AND DISCUSSING THEIR FEELINGS ABOUT IT, I THINK FOR 0311 THE FOUR YEAR TERMS I DO HAVE SOME HESITANCY ON THAT. I DO THINK THAT PERHAPS, AND THIS WOULD BE SOMETHING FOR THE BILL'S AUTHOR THE COMMITTEE CHAIR THAT IF SOMETHING WERE TO MOVE FORWARD ON THIS FRONT PUTTING IN A PROVISION THAT THERE WOULD BE STILL ONE FURTHER MUNICIPAL ELECTION ON THE TWO-YEAR TERMS, BEFORE THE FOUR YEARS GO INTO EFFECT, I THINK THAT'S SOMETHING THAT COUNCILOR O'MALLEY MAY HAVE ALLUDED TO AND THE ISSUE OF THIS BEING SOMETHING THAT IS NOT DIRECTLY IMPACTING THE FOLKS WHO VOTE ON IT, THAT THERE WOULD BE ANOTHER MUNICIPAL ELECTION, STAY THIS PASSIONS AT THE STATE HOUSE TOMORROW WE STILL HAVE TO GO THROUGH 2019 AND THEN 2021 WOULD BE THE FIRST. THAT'S JUST SOMETHING WOULD I SUGGEST AS WE'RE TALKING ABOUT THIS AND TO MAKE SURE THAT IN THE INTEREST OF GOOD GOVERNMENT AND TRANSPARENCY THAT THE PEOPLE WHO WE ARE THROUGH ALL THESE EFFORTS TRYING TO MAKE IT EASIER FOR THEM TO HOLD THEIR ELECTED OFFICIALS ACCOUNTABLE, WHEN WE PARTICIPATE IN THIS PROCESS THAT WE'RE MINDFUL OF THAT. AND I THINK THESE ARE GOOD DISCUSSIONS TO BE HAVING. I DO I -- I THINK COUNCILOR, YOU MENTIONED THIS, WHEN SOMEONE IS ON THE BALLOT FOR TWO OFFICES THE VOTERS MAYBE SOMETIMES TAKE CARE OF THAT PROBLEM THEMSELVES. IT'S CERTAINLY SOMETHING WORTH DISCUSSING AND I THINK IN GENERAL WE'RE TALKING ABOUT ELECTION MODERNIZATION, ACCESS TO EVERYONE IN THE CITY AND TO COUNSELOR FLYNN'S COMMENTS, FOR PEOPLE SERVING OVERSEAS, THAT IS OF PARAMOUNT CONCERN TO ME AS CHAIRMAN OF OUR CIVIL RIGHTS COMMITTEE, THAT EVERYONE HAS ACCESS.

THAT IS THE LENS THROUGH WHICH I'M VIEWING ALL THE PROPOSALS, I LOOK FORWARD TO OUR DEBATE ON THESE ISSUES.

MECHANICALLY SPEAKING, THESE ARE ALL DOABLE, FOR VOTERS, AS WELL AS WHAT WE'RE DOING UP AT THE STATE HOUSE.

>> THANK YOU, MR. CHAIRMAN AND MADAM PRESIDENT FOR YOUR LEADERSHIP ON THIS. I JUST, I SUPPOSE MORE OF A STATEMENT THAN ACTUALLY I'LL HAVE ONE QUESTION AT THE END. BUT I JUST WANTED TO GET ON RECORD HERE, THAT I COMPLETELY AGREE WITH THE INTENTION BEHIND TRYING TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE BEING EXTREMELY RESPONSIBLE ABOUT CITY FUNDING, AND THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH ELECTIONS AND RUNNING AND TO RECOGNIZE THAT THE HIGHER THE VOTER TURNOUT, THE MORE MEANINGFUL FEEDBACK THERE IS.

I DO WANT TO JUST STATE THAT I
HAVE CONCERNS WITH ALL THREE
DOCKETS, AND FEEL MY CONCERN IS
THAT EACH OF THESE IN SOME WAYS
GETS CLOSER TO RESTRICTING
BALLOT ACCESS THAN EXPANDING IT.
AND PARTICULARLY NOW, IN THIS
MOMENT, WE SHOULD BE DOING
EVERYTHING TO TAKE DOWN BARRIERS
FOR PARTICIPATION.
BUT JUST GOING ONE BY ONE, AND I
THINK SOME OF THIS IS JUST IS

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THINKING

PHILOSOPHICALLY AND IN REALITY,

ABOUT IN PRINCIPLE AND

KIND OF WHAT THE ACTUAL MECHANISMS ARE AND WHAT INDIVIDUAL EXPERIENCES ARE. SO I'LL GO THROUGH ONE BY ONE. 0311, TWO YEAR VERSUS FOUR YEAR TERM, I UNDERSTAND WHERE THE PROPONENTS ARE GOING THROUGH IN COST AND GIVING MORE TIME. BUT THE REALITY IS THAT UNLESS THERE IS CAMPAIGN FINANCE REFORM THIS WILL MEAN THAT INCUMBENTS HAVE MORE TIME THE BUILD UP WAR CHESTS AND IT WILL BE MORE DIFFICULT FOR NEWCOMERS TO TRY TO RAISE THE AMOUNT OF MONEY NEEDED TO COMPETE AND POTENTIALLY RUN FOR OFFICE AGAIN AGAINST AN INCUMBENT. SO ABSENT CAMPAIGN FINANCE REFORM, I WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO SUPPORT THAT ONE. THE SECOND ONE, I THINK I FEEL THE LEAST STRONGLY ABOUT, SIMILAR TO COUNCILOR O'MALLEY. IN SOME WAYS IT'S A STATEMENT TO THE VOTERS ABOUT YOUR INTENTION. BUT AT THE SAME TIME, I WOULD ESPECIALLY IN THIS MOMENT ERR ON THE SIDE OF JUST LETTING PEOPLE MAKE THEIR CHOICES AND THEN PUTTING THAT UP FOR A VOTE. AND THEN FINALLY, 0313, THE SPECIAL ELECTION FOR AT LARGE, I THINK COUNCILOR FLAHERTY, I THINK THIS IS JUST OUR EXPERIENCES COLORING THIS VERSUS DISTRICT COUNCILORS, IT IS INCREDIBLY INTENSE TO RUN A CITYWIDE ELECTION. I DO WORRY THAT IF THERE WERE A PERIOD IF IT WERE THE SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE SAME TIME FRAMES, I DON'T KNOW HOW SOMEONE COULD KIND OF EMERGE WITHOUT ANY PRIOR INFRASTRUCTURE AND THEREFORE IT WOULD FAVOR THOSE WHO EITHER CAME IN FIFTH PLACE TO BEGIN WITH. OR HAVE SOME OTHER CONNECTIONS OR POLITICAL INFLUENCE. AND SO IN SOME WAYS, MY THINKING IS THAT THE CURRENT SYSTEM MAKES IT SUCH THAT RUNNING FOR OFFICE. EVEN IF THERE ARE FOUR

INCUMBENTS RUNNING AT LARGE, IF THERE IS VALUE TO CHALLENGING AND BEING PART OF THAT CONVERSATION AND MAKES THESE REGULAR AT-LARGE ELECTIONS MORE MEANINGFUL, WITH MORE OPPORTUNITIES FOR TAKING ONE OF THOSE SEATS OR TAKING THAT FIFTH PLACE SLOT, SO THAT I WORRY THAT IF WE DID THIS, IT WOULD ALSO MEAN THAT YOU KNOW PEOPLE WOULD BE LESS LIKELY TO CHALLENGE AGAINST THE INCUMBENTS AND JUST KIND OF WEIGH AND THEN IT WOULD BE DIFFICULT TO RAMP UP THE **ELECTION AGAIN GIVEN THE** REALITIES OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE, AND WHAT OUR EXPERIENCES HAVE BEEN IN REAL LIFE. SO I AGREE WITH THE INTENTION BEHIND TRYING TO KIND OF STREAMLINE AND STRENGTHEN THE COUNCIL. BUT I JUST THINK THAT WE SHOULD ERR, ENTIRELY, TON SIDE OF OPENING UP THE BALLOT AT THIS POINT AND BRINGING IN NEW VOICES AND NOT AT ALL ANYTHING THAT WOULD POTENTIALLY STRENGTHEN INCUMBENCY OVER POTENTIAL CHALLENGERS. BUT, IT IS FOR ME ABOUT SAVING MONEY AND ALL THESE BILLS FOR ALIGNMENT, IF WE HAVE A MAYOR FOR FOUR YEARS, I WANT US TO BE ALIGNED BECAUSE I THINK THAT ALLOWS THE COUNCILORS TO GEP GET MORE THINGS DONE AS AN INSTITUTION. WE DO SPECIAL ELECTIONS FOR UNITED STATES SENATE SEATS NOW SO THE SIZE OF THE DISTRICT I THINK IS NOT REASON ENOUGH TO PREVENT IMPLEMENTING SOME PRETTY EFFECTIVE ELECTIONS REFORM HERE. THANK YOU. >> ALL RIGHT, SEEING THIS OR NO

FROM MY COLLEAGUES, I KNOW WE

EASY IF YOU WANT TO COME RIGHT

DEMOCRACY. BY CIVIC ACCESS, I MEAN ANYONE WHO WANTS TO VOTE CAN VOTE. CIVIC ENGAGEMENT IS EVERYONE WHO WANTS TO VOTE, OR EVERYONE WHO CAN VOTE SHOULD VOTE AND CIVIC REPRESENTATION, IF YOU UNDER YOUR COMMUNITY VOTE THEN YOU SHOULD BE REPRESENTED IN THE HALLS OF POWER INCLUDING CITY HALL, THE STATE HOUSE AND MORE. WE WORK WITH THE COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS. AND FOR THE MOST PART VOTERS IN

BOSTON THAT HAS SO MANY RENTERS,

PEOPLE WHO OWN HOMES

DISPROPORTIONATELY HAVE MORE
