ORDER FOR A HEARING REGARDING STUDENT TRANSPORTATION TO BOSTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS

WHEREAS: The City of Boston and Boston Public Schools are committed to securing equitable

educational opportunities for all children; and

WHEREAS: Members of the public have raised a variety of issues regarding equity in school

transportation; and

WHEREAS: Student transportation and routes to school are critical components of a student's

success; and

WHEREAS: Boston Public Schools' Transportation staff work under the serious and difficult

charge of safely, effectively and fairly conducting students between school, enrichment programs and extracurricular activities and their homes across the city;

and

WHEREAS: The city has on certain occasions negotiated with the MBTA to supplement the

municipal fleet in providing bus service; and

WHEREAS: Recent changes in school transportation policy have also directed older students to

use public transportation operated by the MBTA; and

WHEREAS: At the start of the school year, many of Boston's families faced difficulty with

transportation including providing safe transportation for students, supportive transportation for students with an Individualized Education Program, correct and timely pick-up and drop-off locations, direct routes to exam schools, & scheduling

alternative transportation to after-school programs; and

WHEREAS: Transportation difficulties can affect a student's wellness and performance, and some

BPS families have reported difficulty boarding buses, while others are frustrated with disciplinary procedures leveraged to promote compliance with transportation policy;

and

WHEREAS: Equal access to schools and transportation solutions will ensure fair access to quality education for every student; THEREFORE

BE IT ORDERED,

That the appropriate committee of the Boston City Council hold a hearing to discuss school transportation and that staff from Boston Public Schools, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority, impacted parents, students and any other interested parties shall be invited to attend.
