WHEN ASKING ANT STREAMLINING GRADE CONFIGURATIONS.
BUILD B.P.S. SAID THEY NEED MORE INPUT FROM FAMILIES BEFORE THEY COULD START PLANNING CHANGES. SCHOOL COMMUNITIES ACROSS THE DISTRICT HAVE BEEN IN MULTI-YEAR CONVERSATIONS WITH THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ABOUT THE K-6 EXPANSIONS.

STUDENTS -- AS WE KNOW WE ARE LIVING IN A COMPETITIVE GLOBAL ECONOMY THAT REOUIRES OUR STUDENTS TO HAVE COMPETITIVE SKILLS TO ACCESS AND FULLY PARTICIPATE IN THIS ECONOMY AND WE NEED TO ADVOCATE FOR COLLECTIVE METHODS TO CLOSE THE ACHIEVEMENT GAP IN OUR EDUCATION SYSTEM. GIVE THAT BOSTON IS HOME TO THE BEST COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES IN THE WORLD AND SO MANY COMPANIES ARE FOUNDED AND/OR LOOKING TO SUPPORT SHOP, THERE NIECE REASON OUR STUDENTS SHOULDN'T HAVE ACCESS TO THAT WORKFORCE AND WE NEED TO GET THEM READY. >> TYPES THANK COUNCILLOR FLYNN FOR YOUR LEADERSHIP ON THIS INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT ISSUE. YOU ARE LITERALLY HITTING ON PROBABLY TWO TO HAVE THE MOST EXPENSIVE THINGS IN BOSTON, HOUSING AND CHILDCARE, AND IT'S PUSHING A LOT OF OUR FAMILIES OUT OF BOSTON, IN ORDER TO HOUSE, MANY CASES THEY'RE PAYING A MORTGAGE IN TERMS OF CHILDCARE, AND VICE VERSA, IF THEY'RE PAYING CHILDCARE, THEY CAN BARELY AFFORD TO PAY RENTS, AND THAT IS TO SIT AND MAINTAIN A LIFE IN BOSTON, A CITY WE ALL HOLD DEAR.
