AND IT IS SOMETHING THAT I CARE ABOUT DEEPLY AND COMPASSIONATELY.

THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS MAINTAINS THAT ROUGHLY 11% OF THE OVERALL HOMELESS POPULATION -- AND 58,000 VETERANS ARE HOMELESS ON ANY GIVEN NIGHT.

AND TWICE AS MANY EXPERIENCED HOMELESSNESS AT SOME POINT DURING THE COURSE OF A YEAR. HOMELESS VETERANS TEND TO BE MALE, 91%.

SINGLE, 98%, LIVE IN THE CITY, 76%, HAVE MENTAL AND PHYSICAL DISABILITY, 54% AND ARE BLACK, 39%.

THERE ARE MANY FACTORS AND INFLUENCES FOR ALL HOMELESSNESS IN BOSTON SUCH AS SCARCITY OF AFFORDABLE HOUSING, MINIMUM WAGE UNDER \$15 AN HOUR AND NOT ENOUGH ACCESSION TO QUALITY HEALTHCARE. A LARGE NUMBER OF DISPLACED AND VULNERABLE VETERANS LIVE WITH THE NEGATIVE EFFECT OF POST TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE ISSUES WHICH ARE EXASPERATED BY LIKE A FAMILY AND SOCIAL SUPPORT NETWORK. VETERANS SUFFER FROM PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH CONDITIONS THAT MAKE IT DIFFICULT TO FIND AND MAINTAIN GAINFUL EMPLOYMENT. AND THUS PAY FOR HOUSING AND MILITARY OPTIONAL SPECIALTIES

AND MILITARY TRAINING ARE NOT ALWAYS TO THE CIVILIAN'S WORK FORCE.

PLACING VETERANS AT A SERVICE DISADVANTAGE WHEN LOOKING FOR EMPLOYMENT BECAUSE OF THEIR SERVICE IN THE ARMED FORCES. VETERANS ARE A HIGH RISK OF EXPERIMENTAL TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY.

PTSD.

BOTH OF WHICH HAVE BEEN FOUND TO BE AMONG THE MOST SUBSTANTIAL RISK FACTORS FOR HOMELESSNESS. WHILE IT'S TIME TO ADDRESS VETERANS HOMELESS PROBLEMS IT REMAINS TO BE SEEN. HOWEVER THE PROGRAM HAS BEEN ESPECIALLY GIVEN CAN THE NUMBER OF VETERANS LIVING ON THE STREETS IN BOSTON RIGHT NOW. THE CITY OF BOSTON HAS A

RESPONSIBILITY TO ENSURE THAT OUR VETERANS RECEIVE THE CARE

AND BENEFIT THEY HAVE RIGHTFULLY

EARNED IN KEEPING AMERICA SAFE

AND TO CREATE A SAFE HOME FOR THEM TOO, FOR ALL THESE REASONS

I ASK THAT WE HOLD A HEARING TO

DISCUSS THE STATE OF VETERANS

HOMELESSNESS IN BOSTON AND HOW TO BETTER CONNECT VETERANS TO

SUPPORT SERVICES AND CARE.

WE ALSO WANT TO TEACH OUR STUDENTS TO RECOGNIZE THE HORROR OF GENOCIDE AND THAT THEY SHOULD SPEAK UP WHEN THEY SEE SUFFERING AND OPPRESSION OF VULNERABLE PEOPLE.

IF THIS BILL PASSES, BPS WOULD BE REQUIRED TO TEACH THEIR STUDENTS ABOUT THE HISTORY OF GENOCIDE, INCLUDING AND NOT LIMITED TO THE HISTORY OF THE HOLOCAUST AS WELL.
